## RE: Chapter 480-107 WAC Rulemaking Docket No. UE-030423

### TO INTERESTED PERSONS:

On April 15, 2003, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to consider revisions to Chapter 480-107 WAC, "Electric Companies-purchases of electricity from qualifying facilities and independent power producers and purchases of electrical savings from conservation suppliers." The CR-101, as filed with the Code Reviser, is available for inspection on the Commission's web site at <u>www.wutc.wa.gov/030423</u>. The review of Chapter 480-107 WAC, "Electric Companies-purchases of electricity from qualifying facilities and independent power producers and purchases of electrical savings from conservation suppliers" is part of the Commission's overall review of its rules. Chapter 480-107 WAC will be reviewed for content and readability, with attention to the rules' need; effectiveness and efficiency; clarity; intent and statutory authority; coordination; cost; and fairness. The review will also consider whether the current rules have achieved their intended results, and whether they are consistent with Commission policies and advances in technology.

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Subjects included in this review may cover but are not limited to:

- conditions that trigger a Request for Proposals (RFP) process, such as a LCP filing or a "need for power" event,
- conditions to waive a RFP process,
- schedule for a RFP process,
- staff role in a RFP process,
- the need to clarify the beneficiary of competitive markets under regulated monopolies, specifically fairness for providers or reasonableness for consumers,
- the need to ensure that only non-interested parties are reviewers of the RFP and the bidding process,
- discussion of approval of acquisitions and projects prior to a general rate case,
- consistency with Chapter 480-146 WAC "Securities and Affiliated Interests," and
- consistency with the Energy Policy Act (EPACT) and FERC 888/889 for wheeling issues.
