COMMISSION STAFF'S RESPONSE TO KELLEY'S TRANSPORTATION, INC.'S

APPLICATION FOR MITIGATION

Pursuant to WAC 480-07-370(1)(c), Commission Staff submits this response to Kelley's Transportation, Inc.'s Application for Mitigation.

I. BACKGROUND

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) assessed penalties totaling \$1,500 against Kelley's Transportation, Inc. (Kelley's) in a Notice of Penalties Incurred served on March 31, 2005 and received by Kelley's on May 1, 2006. The Commission assessed penalties for a violation of RCW 81.04.530, which requires transportation companies to implement a controlled substances and alcohol testing program. On May 2, 2006, Kelley's filed an Application for Mitigation of Penalties (Application).

Kelley's operates in Washington as a charter passenger carrier under Permit No. CH-395.¹ On March 7, 2006, the Motor Carrier Safety Section Staff (Staff) conducted a compliance review and safety inspection of Kelley's, including terminal safety records and equipment.² This inspection culminated in a March 7, 2006 Compliance Report.³ The inspection found that Kelley's Transportation employed three Commercial Driver Licensed Class B drivers and one Commercial Driver Licensed Class A driver.⁴ The inspection

further found that Kelley's Transportation is operating without a controlled substances and alcohol testing program.⁵ This violated RCW 81.04.530, which adopts by reference Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), §382.115(a). Because RCW 81.04.530 allows penalties up to \$1,500 dollars for conducting a commercial motor vehicle operation without having a controlled substances and alcohol testing program in place, the Commission issued a \$1,500 penalty.⁶

II. ARGUMENT

In its Application for Mitigation of Penalties, Kelley's requests a mitigation of the penalty, with two arguments: First, that it initially had a testing program in place, and reestablished a program after Staff's recent inspection; and second, that the use of independent contractors by Kelley's Transportation, Inc. does not impose on the company an obligation of an employer as provided by 49 CFR §382.115. Staff opposes waiving or mitigating the assessed penalty.

A. The Penalty Assessed for Conducting Operations without Having a Controlled Substances and Alcohol Testing Program is Appropriate.

In its Application for Mitigation of Penalties, Kelley's states that the penalty should be mitigated because it initially had a controlled substances and alcohol testing program in place for employees, but discontinued the program as not applicable to it, and has now reinstated the testing program the same day it was notified of the violation.⁷ This argument should be rejected.

The federal statute concerning drug and alcohol testing for motor carriers, as put forth in 49 CFR §382.103(a), applies to every person and to all employers of such persons

who operate a commercial vehicle in commerce in any state. The penalty against Kelley's was assessed for violation of 49 CFR §382.115(a), which states that "all domestic-domiciled employers must implement the requirements of this part concerning a controlled substances and alcohol testing program on the date the employer begins commercial motor vehicle operations." The effective date of these regulations was July 11, 1997. Kelley's currently operates four 16-passenger vehicles, which are commercial motor vehicles as defined under 49 CFR §383.5. These vehicles are operated by three drivers with a Class B Commercial Driver's License and one driver with a Class A Commercial Driver's License. Because each of the four vehicles is a commercial motor vehicle, Kelley's is subject to these regulations. There was no testing program in place for the drivers of these vehicles. 10 Kellev's acknowledges that it has been regulated by the Commission as a motor carrier for approximately ten years and explains that it discontinued an initial testing program for its drivers by choice until the date Staff conducted a safety inspection and discovered the noncompliance. 11 A penalty is warranted under RCW 81.04.530 for conducting operations without a program. Kelley's is responsible for understanding and complying with the statute by which it is regulated. The penalty is appropriate.

In addition, in its Application for Mitigation of Penalties, Kelley's requests that the penalty be mitigated because it is a "reasonable inference" from the regulations that in order to be an employer, a company must have employees; because Kelley's has only "independent contractors" it has no "employees." Therefore, Kelley's argues, it is not

required by the statute to implement a controlled substances and alcohol testing program.¹² This argument should also be rejected.

First, Staff is not convinced that Kelley's drivers are independent contractors. In order for a driver to be considered an independent contractor, that driver must have its own state-issued permit that authorizes him or her to transport passengers. Kellev's drivers do not have such individual authority. 13 Therefore, they should be considered employees of Kelley's, operating under Kelley's permit authority.

Second, Kelley's has complied with related federal motor carrier regulations from 49 CFR §390 to §399, and therefore has demonstrated that it considers its drivers to be employees. These regulations include requirements for driver qualifications, hours of service, vehicle inspection and maintenance, and more. ¹⁴ Kelley's compliance clearly shows its control over its drivers and the means and methods of their work, consistent with an employer-employee relationship. Kelley's argument that its drivers are simply independent contractors who need no testing is invalid when it has selectively chosen to comply with regulations governing employees.

Third, even if its drivers are independent contractors, Kelley's is still required to include them in a controlled substances and alcohol testing program. ¹⁵ The statute, in 49 CFR §382.107, defines an employer as "a person or entity employing one or more employees...that is subject to DOT agency regulations requiring compliance with this part" and as "the entity responsible for overall implementation of DOT drug and alcohol testing requirements." The statute contains no express exemptions for employers who use

independent contractors as drivers. In addition, 49 CFR §382 does not independently define the term "employee." Rather, a general definition of "employee" is provided in 49 CFR §390.5, which expressly applies to the entire chapter and subchapter. Here, an "employee" includes "any driver of a commercial motor vehicle, including independent contractors." Thus, Kelley's is required to have an alcohol testing program in place for its drivers regardless of how it chooses to classify them, and the penalty is appropriate.

Finally, public policy supports denying the company's request for mitigation. The federal statute requiring a drug and alcohol testing program, incorporated into state law, furthers the safety goals of reducing crashes, fatalities, and injuries. Motor carriers have a paramount responsibility of safety to the public they serve, and should know about the requirements for testing. Consequently, the penalty associated with this matter is appropriate.

III. CONCLUSION

Staff does not support mitigating the assessed penalty. Accordingly, Staff requests that the Commission deny Kelley's Application for Mitigation of Penalties.

- 1. I am over 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States, a resident of the state of Washington, and competent to be a witness.
- 2. I am employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) as a Compliance Specialist in the Business Practices Investigations Section. I have been employed at the Commission for over 14 years, holding various positions. As a Compliance Specialist, my responsibilities include producing penalty assessments for signature by the commissioners. As part of those duties, I receive compliance reviews or other inspections or investigations where staff has recommended penalties and draft orders for consideration by the commission.

On March 13, 2006, I received the Kelley's Transportation, Inc., compliance review with a staff recommendation for a penalty of \$1,500 for violation of controlled substance and alcohol testing requirements. I drafted the order for the commission's consideration. The commissioners signed the penalty assessment order on March 31, 2006.

DECLARATION OF LEON MACOMBER

I, LEON MACOMBER, under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington, declare as follows:

- 1. I am over 18 years of age, a citizen of the United States, a resident of the state of Washington, and competent to be a witness.
- 2. I am employed by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) as a Special Investigator in the Motor Carrier Safety Section. I have been employed at the Commission for over 30 years, holding various positions. As a Special Investigator, my responsibilities include conducting investigations regarding the motor carrier safety practices of regulated transportation companies. As part of those duties, I conduct in-depth and complex audits, perform carrier reviews of terminal safety records and equipment, including driver and vehicle safety requirements and issue safety ratings.
- 3. On May 2, 2006, Kelley's Transportation, Inc. (Kelley's) filed with the Commission an Application for Mitigation of Penalties (Mitigation Request) in Docket No. TE-060395. I have read the Mitigation Request.
- 4. This Mitigation Request arises from a Notice of Penalties Incurred and Due for Violations of Laws, Rules and Regulations issued by the Commission on March 31, 2006, in Docket No. TE-060395. In that Notice, the Commission issued penalties of \$1,500.00 for a violation of RCW 81.04.530, which adopts by reference Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 382.115(a), requiring transportation companies to implement a controlled substances and alcohol testing program.

5. Before recommending the Commission issue penalties, I, as part of my job, conducted a carrier review on March 7, 2006, of Kelley's Transportation, Inc., including terminal safety records and equipment. A true and accurate copy of the Compliance Review report is attached to this declaration as Attachment A.

Specific Issues Addressed by Kelley's in its Mitigation Request

Company Had a Testing Program in Place for Many Years

- 6. In its Mitigation Request, Kelley's stated it had a controlled substance and alcohol testing program in place for many years, however, upon advice from its attorney it discontinued the program. The company reinstated the testing program the same day it was notified it was in violation.
- 7. CFR 49.382.103(a) states that Part 382 applies to every person and to all employers of such persons who operate a commercial motor vehicle in commerce in any state. In addition, CFR 49.382.115(a) states that all domestic-domiciled employers must implement the requirements of this part on the date the employer begins commercial motor vehicle operations. The effective date for these rules was July 11, 1997.
- 8. Kelley's currently operates four 16-passenger vehicles. All are commercial motor vehicles by definition under CFR 49.383.5. Kelley's 16-passenger vehicles are operated by three drivers with a Class B Commercial Driver's License and one driver with a Class A Commercial Driver's License. Because each of the four vehicles is considered commercial motor vehicles, Kelley's is subject to the federal regulations requiring companies to implement and maintain a controlled substances and alcohol testing program.


Company Does Not Have Any Employees, Only Independent Contractors

- 9. In addition, Kelley's stated that it is a "reasonable inference" from the regulations that in order to be an employer, a company must have employees. Kelley's reports it has no employees. It states that all individuals who drive Kelley's Transportation's vehicles are independent contractors.
- 10. Staff believes the company's request for mitigation is not valid for several reasons.

- 11. Staff is not convinced the drivers of the vehicles are independent contractors. In order to be independent contractors, each driver must have its own state-issued permit that authorizes him or her to transport passengers. Kelley's Transportation drivers do not have such authority. Even if the drivers are independent contractors, Kelley's Transportation is still required to include them in controlled substance and alcohol testing program. CFR 49.390 establishes general applicability and definitions for Chapter 49. Part 390.5 states that, "unless specifically defined elsewhere, in this subchapter ..employee"...includes any driver of a commercial motor vehicle, including independent contractors. Since CFR 49.382 does not independently adopt a definition of "employee" it falls under the general definition, which includes independent contractors.
- 12. In addition, the company complied with other federal regulations, from CFR 49.390 to CFR 49.399. It appears the company did not consider its drivers independent contractors for the purposes of these regulations, which include requirements for driver qualifications, hours of service, vehicle inspection and maintenance, and more. I find its argument that the drivers are independent contractors invalid when there is evidence that it complied with some regulations under CFR 49 and not others.
- 13. The violation associated with this matter is appropriate and I do not recommend mitigation based on the company's request.

On March 7, 2006 I contacted Mr. Alex Milman, President of Kelley's Transportation, Inc., concerning a carrier review "CR" of their terminal safety records and equipment.

I also interviewed Mr. Igor Milman, Manager of Kelley's Transportation, Inc., at this time.

I performed Level 5 terminal safety inspections of six of six vehicles currently operated by Kelley's Transportation, Inc. with the following results:

Six of Six vehicles currently operated by Kelley's Transportation, Inc. were inspected Three of Six vehicles inspected were found with defects (50% Defect Ratio) Zero of Six vehicles inspected were placed out-of-service (0% Out-of-Service Ratio)

Specific defects can be seen by referencing my Uniform Driver/Vehicle Inspection Report forms #1224610 thru #1224614 and #1224618. CVSA stickers were affixed to all six vehicles.

Kelley's Transportation, Inc. operates four 16-passenger vehicles and two 11-passenger vehicles. All four 16-passenger vehicles require at least Class C CDL drivers and currently Kelley's Transportation, Inc. has three Class B CDL drivers and one Class A CDL driver and three non-CDL drivers.

Given the 16-passenger configuration of their four vehicles, Kelley's Transportation, Inc. is required to implement an alcohol and/or controlled substances testing program which they do not have in violation of CFR 382.115(a).

In addition, all four CDL drivers did not receive a negative pre-employment controlled substances test result prior to driving for Kelley's Transportation, Inc. in violation of CFR 382.301(a).

All seven driver's qualification files were examined and found to be in-complete in violation of CFR 391.51(a).

All seven driver's hours of service records were examined from February 1, 2006 thru February 28, 2006 and I found no

apparent violations of 10 hour, 15 hour and/or 60-7day and 70-8day rules.

Driver vehicle inspection reports, "DRIR's", were well maintained and retained beyond the 90-day requirement on all six vehicles.

Vehicle inspection, repair and maintenance records were well maintained with regard to daily repair records and all six vehicles are inspected at least once a month on a scheduled basis.

This carrier review "CR" terminal safety inspection of records and equipment did result in a "Conditional Safety Rating" and all violations were discussed with Mr. Alex Milman, President, and Mr. Igor Milman, Manager, and considerable technical, educational assistance and forms were given.
