COMMISSION STAFF'S  
RESPONSE TO ITS' REQUEST  
FOR HEARING

1 Pursuant to WAC 480-07-370(1)(c), Staff of the Washington Utilities and  
Transportation Commission (Commission Staff) submits this response<sup>1</sup> to Irvington Transfer  
and Storage d/b/a ITS Global Relocation Services' (ITS) Request for Hearing.

2 On December 4, 2009, the Commission assessed a \$900 penalty against ITS for  
violations of Tariff 15-C and WAC 480-15-630(3). ITS filed a Request for Hearing on  
December 15, 2009. In its Request for Hearing, ITS stated that some of the alleged  
violations did occur, while some of the alleged violations did not occur; however, ITS did  
not elaborate upon which of the alleged violations it is admitting, and which of the alleged  
violations it intends to contest at hearing. Commission Staff does not oppose ITS' Request  
for Hearing.
