- On June 4, 2014, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued Penalty Assessment TV-140933 against A & E, Inc. (A & E or company) in the amount of \$100, alleging a violation of WAC 480-15-480, which requires permitted household goods carrier companies to file annual reports with the Commission by May 1 each year and pay regulatory fees annually on that date.
