1 On May 27, 2014, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued Penalty Assessment TE-1401066 against Lady In A Limo in the amount of \$1,000, alleging a violation of WAC 480-30-071, which requires permitted charter and excursion carrier companies to file annual reports with the Commission by May 1 each year and pay regulatory fees annually on that date.

2 On June 4, 2014, Lady In A Limo filed with the Commission a request for hearing stating that they did not receive an original violation notice as the business name and address had changed. Lady In A Limo goes on to say that they had been working with Commission staff who was aware of the new business name (Tux Ride) and address, 19550 International Blvd., Suite 304, SeaTac, WA 98188.

3 Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for determining whether the alleged violation of WAC 480-30-071 occurred and, if so, whether the penalty should be mitigated.

4 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 9:30 a.m., on Tuesday, August 26, 2014, in Room 206, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.**

5 The record in this case will consist of any documents regarding the matter that are considered by or prepared for the presiding officer for the brief adjudicative

proceeding and a transcript of any oral statements given at the hearing, which statements will be given under oath.

6 Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. The Commission will provide at its offices in Olympia, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.

7 Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission a list enumerating and describing any such documents **no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 19, 2014**, and bring an original and three (3) copies to the hearing. Filing shall be in accordance with WAC 480-07-140 and – 145.

8 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.**
