- On February 18, 2015, Lauts, Inc., d/b/a Lautenbach Industries, filed an application with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) requesting authority to provide Solid Waste Collection Service consisting of chicken feathers, DAF sludge, and chicken blood from Foster Farms to Republic's Klickitat Landfill under contract with Foster Farms.
- 2 On May 14, 2015, the Commission published the application on the application docket.
- The Commission has determined that it does not have jurisdiction over this application because the affected business Foster Farms is located wholly within an incorporated city that has asserted jurisdictional control over all commercial solid waste collection and transportation pursuant to RCW 35.02.160 and RCW 81.77.020. As a result, the city of Kelso is exempt from RCW 81.77 for solid waste collection.
- The application filed by Laut's Inc., d/b/a Lautenbach Industries, in Docket TG-150264 should be dismissed.

- THE COMMISSION ORDERS the application filed by Laut's Inc., d/b/a Lautenbach Industries, in Docket TG-150264, is dismissed.
