To Whom it May Concern,

For the first time in 10 years, since I have worked for Paracom, Inc., I filed my Annual Report late. The paperwork did not reach my desk, and all emails and correspondence from WUTC went to my boss, who is frequently out of town. It has always been my intention to comply with annual reporting in a timely manner, which I have responsibly done until now. Our total gross intrastate operating revenue was less than \$3,000, and this fine is \$1,000. The payphone industry has declined so drastically, that we finally removed all of our payphones before the end of 2016. We will have one more annual report to file for 2017 for a very small amount of revenue to report. I am asking for leniency from the commission to reduce the amount of this fine. It was my fault that I didn't have the due date written down on my calendar; I accept that and just ask that you would reduce the fine. As soon as I became aware of the situation, I immediately filed the annual report and included the interest and penalties in the payment. We have been very helpful to the WUTC, in filling out questionnaires, and going the extra mile to help in any way we can. We have worked with Tim Zawislak on these requests. We have always had a good relationship with the WUTC. I am asking for leniency in this situation.

(1) A person is guilty of perjury in the first degree if in any official proceeding he makes a materially false statement which he knows to be false under an oath required or authorized by law. (2) Knowledge of the materiality of the statement is not an element of this crime, and the actor's mistaken belief that his statement was not material is not a defense to a prosecution under this section. (3) Perjury in the first degree is a class B felony."
