NOTICE OF PREHEARING
CONFERENCE

**(Set for August 2, 2018,
at 9:30 a.m.)**

1 On May 30, 2018, Whatcom County filed with the Washington Utilities and
Transportation Commission (Commission) a Petition for Installation of Median Barriers
at a Highway –Rail Grade Crossing (Petition). The Petition seeks to install median
barriers at the crossing on Cliffside Drive in Bellingham, Washington.

2 **STATUTORY AUTHORITY:** The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under
RCW Title 80 and RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate railroads. The
statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 80.01, RCW 80.04, and RCW 81.53,
including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.04.020, and RCW 81.53.06. The
rules that apply to this matter include those within Washington Administrative Code
(WAC) 480-62, relating to railroads.

3 The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA),
particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA
that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to: RCW 34.05.413, RCW
34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The
Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.

4 The Commission finds there is good cause to hear this matter on shortened notice. *See*
WAC 480-07-440(1)(a) and RCW 34.05.434.

5 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a prehearing conference in
this matter at 9:30 a.m., on August 2, 2018, in the Commission’s Hearing Room,
Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W.,
Olympia, Washington.**

6 The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence, to identify the issues in the proceeding, and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430.

7 **INTERVENTION:** Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. *See* WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. *See* WAC 480-07-345(2). Any party or witness in need of an interpreter or other assistance should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.

8 **THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.**
