CORRECTION IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR PUGET SOUND ENERGY CUSTOMERS ABOUT PROPOSED CHANGES IN RATES

A notice which ran in this newspaper on August 31, 2019 contained errors in the proposed changes to electric rates. This notice contains corrected proposed electric rates. Natural gas rates in the August 31, 2019 notice were correct.

Puget Sound Energy (PSE) recently filed requests with the state Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) to adjust electric rates. The requested changes, proposed to be effective on October 12, 2019, include:

- Energy Exchange Credit (listed on statement): An increase in electric rates for residential and small farm customers due to a decrease in the amount of the Energy Exchange Credit, based on agreement with the Bonneville Power Administration.
- Low Income Program: An overall increase in electric rates to recover changes in costs for the low
 income bill-payment assistance program. PSE requested these changes through the existing low income
 assistance mechanism previously approved by the UTC. The mechanism allows PSE to periodically
 adjust its electric and natural gas rates to reflect changes in actual sales and costs. The proposed
 adjustments would be reflected in the Electricity charge listed on the electric statement.

Effects on residential customers

The monthly bill effects of the rate changes for the typical residential electric customer are shown in this chart. Individual customers will see a greater or lesser decrease than what is shown, depending on the amount of usage. Most electric customers are billed monthly. Some electric customers are billed every other month.
