Salamat,

The document you sent is called a certificate of insurance (COI). We can only accept that for up to 60 days, and if the certificate holder is the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission. The copy you sent did not list the WUTC as the certificate holder. You'll need to contact your agent and ask for two things:

1. a new COI that lists the WUTC as certificate holder
2. They need to contact United Financial Casualty for the auto liability and request a Form E filing with the WUTC and they need to contact Century Surety Company for the cargo and request a Form H filing with the WUTC.

Like I said, legally we can only accept a COI for 60 days and must have a Form E and Form H before that time is up.
