Dear Ms. Ygbuhay:

On Feb. 8, 2022, the City of Pacific filed a petition with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) seeking approval to modify warning devices at the 8th Street East crossing, identified as USDOT 396597R. Union Pacific Railroad Company (Union Pacific) must respond with its position related to this petition within 20 days of the date of this letter.

Please review the enclosed petition and respond by March 1, 2022. Your response options include:

- **Support the petition** – Sign Section 13 – Cost Apportionment and complete Section 14 – Waiver of Hearing by Respondent, which serves as Union Pacific’s consent to the UTC to issue an order without further notice or hearing, and submit it to the UTC.
- **Do not support the petitions** – Provide a response including Union Pacific’s reasons for not supporting the petition, whether Union Pacific believes a hearing is necessary to resolve the issues, or suggestions for other courses of action, such as further discussion prior to going to hearing.
