Dear Mr. Killip:

On September 12, 2023, Superior Asphalt was issued a \$1,000 penalty for a violation of RCW 19.122.055(1)(a). Superior Asphalt was provided the opportunity to suspend an \$800 portion of the penalty amount and ultimately waived on the following conditions:

- Superior Asphalt employees attend Dig Safe training provided through the National Utility Contractors Association (NUCA) within 12 months of the date of the penalty assessment; and
- Submit documentation of completion of Dig Safe training to the Commission; and
- Commit no further violations of RCW 19.122 within the 12 months following the penalty assessment.

On September 27, 2023, the Commission received notification from Superior Asphalt that the company admitted the violation occurred and accepted the Commission's offer to suspend the penalty amount based on the stated conditions. The Commission received the required documentation of attendance of training on September 13, 2024, and a payment of \$200 was made on September 29, 2023. Superior Asphalt has had no further violations of RCW 19.122.

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Staff believes that Superior Asphalt has fully complied with the Commission's order, and further compliance under this order is no longer necessary. Staff recommends the Commission waive the suspended \$800 penalty amount and close this docket.
