BACKGROUND

By supplemental petition filed March 20, 2001, in Docket UT-960466, United Communications, Inc., (UNICOM) seeks to amend its registration authority as a telecommunications company and classification as a competitive telecommunications company pursuant to RCW 80.36.350 and 80.36.320. UNICOM also filed revisions to its price list.

DISCUSSION

UNICOM proposes to amend its competitive classification and registration authority with the Commission as a telecommunications company to offer local exchange services. Services specified in Exhibit A but not included in its initial price list may not be offered until applicant amends its price list to include the description of service with rates and charges. In support of its petition, UNICOM asserts that its services compete with other interexchange and local exchange carriers telecommunication services. UNICOM states that customers have readily available equivalent alternatives and that there are no captive customers of the Company's services.

UNICOM is an Oregon corporation, headquartered in Bend, Oregon, and is owned by Craig G. Nelson and Susan J. Nelson. Rates, terms, and conditions set forth in the revisions to its price list are structured similarly to rates filed by other interexchange and local exchange carriers for calls placed in the relevant market.

UNICOM has provided information showing that it meets the requirements of RCW 80.36.350. Applicant does not propose to provide prepaid calling services.

Rules invoked include WAC 480-120-022, WAC 480-120-023, WAC 480-120-024, and WAC 480-120-025. Statutes invoked include RCW 80.36.320 and RCW 80.36.350. The ultimate issues are whether the proposed amendments to UNICOM's registration and competitive classification should be approved.

This matter was brought before the Commission at its regularly scheduled open meeting on April 11, 2001. The Commissioners, having been fully advised in the matter, and having determined the following order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Secretary to enter the following order and related provisions.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. UNICOM filed a supplemental application to amend its registration authority as a telecommunications company and classification as a competitive telecommunications company pursuant to the provisions of RCW 80.36.350 and 80.36.320, to provide local exchange services.
- 2. As to form, the supplemental application and petition meet the requirements of RCW 80.36.350 and 80.36.320, and comply with the Commission's rules and regulations.
- 3. The amendment of the registration of UNICOM to include local exchange services as a telecommunications company is not inconsistent with the public interest.

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4. In this proceeding, the Commission in no way endorses the financial viability of applicant nor the investment quality of any securities it may issue.

- 5. Alternative providers of service to that of UNICOM include, but are not limited to, Qwest Corporation, Verizon Northwest, Inc., MCI WorldCom Communications, Inc., and Sprint Communications Company L.P. All services are fully available from alternative providers in the relevant market.
 - 6. The relevant market is the state of Washington.
 - 7. UNICOM has no captive customer base.
- 8. UNICOM should be permitted to provide services under its proposed price list.
- 9. UNICOM requested waivers of certain laws and rules relating to telecommunications services. The laws and rules for which waivers should be granted are listed in Appendix A, incorporated by this reference and made a part of this Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this registration application and classification petition and UNICOM.
 - 2. The services offered are subject to effective competition.
- 3. UNICOM should be authorized to provide local exchange services as a telecommunications company pursuant to RCW 80.36.350 and classified as a competitive telecommunications company pursuant to RCW 80.36.320(1).
- 4. UNICOM should be permitted to provide services under price lists promulgated under RCW 80.36.320 (2). These services will not include providing prepaid calling services.
- 5. UNICOM should be granted waivers of the laws and rules listed in Appendix A.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Effective on the date of this Order and subject to any conditions imposed, the Commission approves the supplemental application of United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, requesting an order amending registration authorization as a telecommunications company to provide local exchange services to the public in this state.

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2. The Commission approves the petition of United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, for classification as a competitive telecommunications company; and grants a waiver of the laws and rules listed in the attached Appendix A.

- 3. United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, shall be permitted to provide services under price list.
- 4. Registration of United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, as a telecommunications company shall not be construed as an endorsement of financial viability or of the investment quality of any securities it may issue.
- 5. As a telecommunications company providing service to the public in this state, United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, is subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission under the provisions of Title 80 RCW and all rules and regulations adopted by the Commission.
- 6. United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, is authorized to offer rates and services pursuant to the price list in the format prescribed by the Commission. Services specified in Exhibit A but not included in its initial price list may not be offered until applicant amends its price list to include the description of service with rates and charges. Any price list filed by United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, and subsequent changes to these price lists shall become effective only after ten days'notice to the Commission and to customers. In the event of a price list reduction or of a change in terms and conditions that do not have rate impact, personal notice to customers is not required. To comply with the statutory notice requirement, United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, may publish notice of price reductions or changes in terms and conditions of service that do not have rate impact by a display advertisement in such newspaper(s) as are geographically situated to be circulated over the Company's service area.
- 7. United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, must comply as specified, with the requirements of WAC 480-120-141, operator service providers rules.
- 8. United Communications, Inc., d/b/a UNICOM, is not authorized to provide prepaid calling services.
- 9. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the Company to effectuate the terms of this Order.
