Re: TR-210568 – Notice of Intent to Establish a Railroad Quiet Zone at Spanish Castle **Road, USDOT #065809D** 

Dear Ms. Lange:

On July 20, 2021, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) received notification from Douglas County (County) of its intent to establish a railroad quiet zone at the Spanish Castle Road crossing, identified as USDOT 065809D, on the BNSF Railway Company (BNSF) mainline near Rock Island. This is the only highway-rail grade crossing included in this proposed quiet zone.

On June 30, 2021, UTC Staff (Staff) participated in an onsite quiet zone review of the Spanish Castle Road crossing along with representatives from the County, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), BNSF, and the developer of the Spanish Castle Master Planned Resort, Big River Development, LLC.

The proposed quiet zone will be in effect 24 hours per day, seven days per week, and will extend one-quarter mile on each side of the crossing, which is the minimum length required by Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 222 – Use of Locomotive Horns at Public Highway-Rail Grade Crossings.

The County has installed Supplemental Safety Measures (SSM) to qualify for quiet zone designation, as well as other upgrades described in the notice.

As the information was not provided with the Notice of Intent, Staff requested and received the County's calculations of the impacts of its recent upgrades relative to the National Quiet Zone Risk Index (QZRI). As the crossing now stands with the recently installed SSMs, the County's calculations indicate that the QZRI for the crossing is 1646.19, which the County represents is below the significant risk threshold for the crossing.

Under current federal rules, the UTC may comment on quiet zone proposals but it does not have the authority to approve or deny them. Staff acknowledges that, based on the County's QRZI calculations and subject to verification by the FRA, the crossing will qualify for designation as a quiet zone. Staff supports the recently installed SSMs as well as the other recent improvements, as they will improve safety and reduce the possibility of motorists driving around downed crossing gates when a train is approaching. The recent installation of a pedestrian pathway and signals with gates will also reduce the likelihood of pedestrian trespassing occurring at the crossing.
