NOTICE OF BRIEF ADJUDICATIVE PROCEEDING

SETTING TIME FOR ORAL STATEMENTS (Set for July 25, 2023, at 11 a.m.)

- I On May 17, 2023, JNS Movers Inc. (JNS Movers) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application for authority to operate as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington (Application). The Application lists Justin M. Higbee as JNS Movers' owner.
- I On June 13, 2023, the Commission issued a Notice of Intent to Deny Application for Permanent Authority and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (Notice) in this matter based on its review and investigation of the Application. The Commission alleges that the Applicant's owner, Justin Higbee, has a criminal history including three felony convictions and one gross misdemeanor in the past 10 years that were not reported in the Application. The Notice provided JNS Movers the opportunity to request a hearing to contest the factual allegations by June 27, 2023.
- 2 On June 20, 2023, JNS Movers filed with the Commission a Request for Hearing.
- Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for determining whether JNS Movers' Application for permanent authority should be denied due to the concerns raised after Staff's review and investigation of the Application.
- 4 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a virtual brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, July 25, 2023. - 6 Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. The Commission will provide at its offices in Olympia, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.
- Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission a list enumerating and describing any such documents no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, July 20, 2023, and email such documents to the presiding officer also by 5 p.m. on Friday, July 20, 2023.
- 8 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
