A negative amount in the Credit Detail column indicates an amount refunded back to the WEAF or Winter Help GL account when a customer account closes. This occurs when the recipient has not used the full amount of the pledge awarded to them by their agency. These two columns are also used for Winter Help (columns I and J).
