Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The proposal changes the method by which pipeline safety fees are allocated to regulated pipeline companies. The effect will be that some companies may pay more than under the current rule and others may pay less. The rule does not change the overall amount of fee collection. Affected WACs: WAC 480-75-240 and WAC 480-93-240, Annual pipeline safety fee methodology. Reasons supporting proposal: The proposal is an attempt to improve the fairness and uniformity of the pipeline safety fees application by shifting to a methodology that reflects more of the relative effort expended directly on each regulated pipeline company.
