Dear Chairwoman Showalter:

Attached is the recent United States Supreme Court decision I referenced at our June 3, 2002 meeting. I understand the case revolved around whether the government could prohibit advertising for certain drugs. In its ruling, the Court utilized the Central Hudson test, discussed in prior Qwest comments submitted in this proceeding, to strike down the restriction because the government had failed to demonstrate that alternatives less restrictive of speech were unavailable. The Court observed that even if the statute could be justified as a limitation, the "amount of beneficial speech prohibited" rendered the regulation unconstitutional. This Supreme court decision re-emphasizes the need to avoid adoption of rules that suppress truthful commercial speech.

I have also enclosed Qwest's Reply Comments. Our reply comments are primarily in response to remarks filed by the Electronic Privacy Information Center. I apologize I was unable to submit these comments on June 14, 2002 as requested.

I look forward to your response to Qwest's April 12, 2002 proposed rule revisions. Qwest continues to desire to work with the Commission in the adoption of rules that recognize the free speech rights of both carriers and their customers. Please feel free to call me should you have any questions or if you would like to discuss our proposals further. Should the Commission decide to further modify the proposed customer information rules filed as part of the CR-102, Qwest respectfully requests the Commission share such modifications with the industry at least a week prior to the July 26, 2002 open meeting.
