RE: Consider Establishing a New Chapter Applicable to the Economic Regulation of Hazardous Liquid Pipeline Companies Regulated as Common Carriers by the Commission; Docket No. TO-030288

## TO INTERESTED PERSONS:

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has authorized the filing of a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) with the Code Reviser in Docket No. TO-030288. The focus of this rulemaking will be to consider establishing a new chapter applicable to the economic regulation of hazardous liquid pipeline companies regulated as common carriers by the Commission. The CR-101, as filed with the Code Reviser, is available for inspection on the Commission's web site at <a href="www.wutc.wa.gov/030288">www.wutc.wa.gov/030288</a>. There is currently no chapter of rules that addresses economic regulation of hazardous liquid pipeline companies. Such rules would facilitate the Commission in carrying out its statutory powers and duties, and to respond promptly to rapidly changing regulatory, operational, economic, and consumer issues.

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To that end, Staff proposes that the Commission explore this topic, which is expected to result in consideration of rules that (among other potential subjects):

- Require financial transaction reports twenty days prior to the transfer of cash, credit, or pecuniary interest when certain thresholds have been exceeded.
- Require an annual subsidiary transaction report summarizing all transactions that occurred between the company and its subsidiaries during the preceding year.
- Require an annual affiliated interest transaction report.
- Clarify accounting system requirements.
- Set out retention and preservation of records requirements.
- Establish consumer rules.

## STAKEHOLDER WORKSHOP

The Commission currently is considering financial reporting rules for several industries it regulates in Docket No. A-021178. Draft rules in that docket are similar to rules under consideration in this docket. The draft rules are available for inspection on the Commission's website at <a href="www.wutc.wa.gov/021178">www.wutc.wa.gov/021178</a>. The stakeholder workshop scheduled for April 10, 2003, will consider draft rules in Docket No. A-021178 along with consideration of establishing a new chapter applicable to the economic regulation of hazardous liquid pipeline companies regulated as common carriers in Docket No. TO-030288. Discussion of Docket No. TO-030288 is scheduled for the afternoon session.
