**NOTICE OF INTENT TO CANCEL
CERTIFICATION AS A CHARTER AND EXCURSION CARRIER
AND OPPORTUNITY TO REQUEST A HEARING**

**Re: Miracle Seattle Towncars and Limousine Dispatch LLC
Docket TE-151035**

Staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission has determined that your company, Miracle Seattle Towncars and Limousine Dispatch LLC failed to comply with regulatory reporting requirements.

WAC 480-30-071(2)(d) provides that the commission may cancel a charter or excursion carrier's certificate if the carrier fails to file its annual safety report. Staff has determined that your company failed to file its annual safety report for 2014. This letter, which is being served on your last known address on file with the commission, constitutes notice that the commission intends to cancel your company's certificate.

If you wish to avoid cancellation of your certificate, you must, within 30 days of service of this notice, take one of two actions. The first option is to come into compliance with applicable law by submitting the delinquent annual safety report. Annual safety report forms are available on the commission's website: utc.wa.gov. You may also obtain annual safety report forms by contacting the commission at annualreports@utc.wa.gov.

The second option is to request a hearing to demonstrate why your certificate should not be canceled. All hearing requests must comply with the commission's procedural rules, contained in WAC 480-07, which are available on the commission's website at utc.wa.gov.

If you do not respond to this notice within 30 days of the service date of this notice by complying with the regulatory requirements or by requesting a hearing, the commission will enter an order canceling your certificate without further notice. Unregistered companies are prohibited from providing charter and excursion services in the state of Washington.
