UTILITY RATES FOR 2017

Sewer Utility

There will be no rate increases for the sewer utility in 2017. Per the rate study conducted in 2015, it was determined that sewer rates are sufficient at this time to maintain the sewer collection and treatment systems.

Stormwater Utility

There will be a 4% rate increase for the stormwater utility in 2017. This utility manages all storm water detention ponds and related systems for our city's environment. The state Department of Ecology sets standards that municipalities must follow to maintain these systems. The charge will be a flat fee of \$11.36 per residential unit, to compensate for the amount of impervious surface of each property where water cannot drain into the land. This is an increase of \$0.44 per month.

Water Utility

There will be a 7.5% rate increase for the water utility in 2017. The city purchases all its water from the City of Everett. Everett is increasing the cost to purchase this water. The city had a rate study done in 2015 that demonstrated the need for this increase to keep current with the charges from Everett, and the costs for maintaining the water system. The increase is effective January 1, 2017, and will first show up on the bill received in early February 2017.

Are pet licenses required in the City?

Do I need a business license?

How do I register to vote?

How do I report a pot hole or other unsafe street condition within the Monroe City limits?

How do I report a street light out?

Call Snohomish County PUD at (425) 783-1000 during regular business hours. You will need to provide the address of the pole and the pole number.

Are permits required to build a fence in the City?
