DISCUSSION THEMES

Major Policy Comments Associated with the Integrated Resource Planning (IRP) Rules

- 1. Should considerations of risk be more explicitly required in utility IRPs?
- 2. Should the definition of "lowest reasonable cost" include future potential externalities such as an emission cost for carbon dioxide?
- 3. Should the regulations be neutral in terms of types of resources?
- 4. How wide a net of resource alternatives should utilities assess in their IRPs?
- 5. Should the public participation process be changed?
- 6. Should the IRP include transmission and distribution planning?
- 7. Should Commission acknowledgement of an IRP be considered in determining the prudence of utility acquisitions?

Major Policy Comments Associated with the Competitive Bidding Rules

- 1. Should utilities be given the choice of whether to conduct a bidding process?
- 2. Should "Avoided Cost" be determined using an administrative process rather than the current bidding process?
- 3. Do the draft rules discourage development of "Qualifying Facilities" and cogeneration facilities?
- 4. Should potential future environmental costs be included in the assessment of new resources?
- 5. Should the regulations favor particular types of resources?
- 6. Should utilities be required to issue an RFP when the IRP indicates that the utility does not need additional resources?
