AGREED REQUEST FOR SECOND EXTENSION OF TIME

The Staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission requests that the Commission extend the time for filing Staff answering testimony and exhibits from April 3, 2012 to April 17, 2012, the date on which rebuttal and cross-rebuttal testimony are due. No change in the current hearing date is requested. The parties have authorized Staff to represent their agreement with this second request.

The standard applicable to Staff's request is contained in WAC 480-07-385(2):

The commission will grant a continuance if the requesting party demonstrates good cause for the continuance and the continuance will not prejudice any party or the commission. The commission will grant a timely request to which all parties expressly agree unless it is inconsistent with the public interest or the commission's administrative needs.

Staff and the parties remain optimistic that they will reach a unanimous settlement agreement in this case. The parties anticipate filing testimony, a settlement agreement, and narrative in support thereof on April 17, 2012. Good cause, therefore, exists for the Commission to grant the requested second extension of time.

Moreover, because no change in the scheduled hearing date is requested, an extension of time to file the testimony, settlement agreement, and narrative in support

thereof will not prejudice the Commission. Nor will the requested extension of time be

inconsistent with the public interest or the Commission's administrative needs.
