NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO FILE WRITTEN COMMENTS ON PROPOSED RULES (By July 6, 2020)

and

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE VIRTUAL ADOPTION HEARING (Set for July 28, 2020, at 9:30 a.m.)

Re: Rulemaking to amend the Energy Independence Act (EIA) WAC 480-109, Docket UE-190652

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

This notice is to inform interested persons of the progress made in this rulemaking docket concerning possible adoption of proposed revisions to the rules governing implementation of the Energy Independence Act (EIA). This also provides notice of an opportunity to file written comments on the proposed rule amendments and notice of the formal rule adoption hearing scheduled for July 28, 2020, at 9:30 a.m.

On October 4, 2019, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to consider whether the Commission's rules related to the EIA, codified at Chapter 19.285 RCW, require revision to comply with new statutory requirements. The Commission filed the CR-101 under Docket UE-190652. The Commission conducted a workshop on January 28, 2020, and solicited comments on draft rules. The Commission also issued a Small Business Economic Impact Statement Questionnaire on January 16, 2020, to obtain information regarding the impact of the draft rules on the companies. The draft rules, comments, and SBEIS questionnaire are available in this docket on the Commission's website: http://www.utc.wa.gov/190652.

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On March 27, 2020, the Commission filed a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (CR-102) with the Office of the Code Reviser, along with a Notice of Opportunity to File Written Comments on Proposed Rules and a Notice of Proposed Rule Adoption Hearing.

In response to these notices, the Commission received comments from stakeholders, some of whom requested a modification to the definition of "low-income" to include the second available metric of area median income set at the statutory maximum of 80 percent. The Commission proposes to incorporate this metric in its definition of "low-income," in addition to other minor changes to the proposed rules filed with the Office of the Code Reviser on March 27, 2020. Those additional changes include:

- Clarifying language pertaining to low-income conservation;
- Updating two subsection titles to more accurately reflect their content, and
- Referencing the Clean Energy Transformation Act in WAC 480-109-300(2).

The modification to the definition of "low-income" is intended to denote thresholds of eligibility only. Guidance related to assistance program design, prioritization of benefits, and benefit calculations will come later and be informed by RCW 19.405.120. Specifically, RCW 19.405.120(2) requires utilities to prioritize low-income households with a higher energy burden, to the extent practicable.

On June 4, 2020, the Commission filed a revised Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (CR-102) with the Office of the Code Reviser. The proposed rules amend sections of chapter 480-109 WAC. The Commission has reviewed the comments received from stakeholders to date in this docket and has prepared proposed rules for review and comment by interested persons. The proposed rules are available for inspection on the Commission's web page at http://www.utc.wa.gov/190652. The CR-102 filing initiates the final part of the rulemaking process, which includes a written comment period, a public adoption hearing, and a decision by the Commission.

WRITTEN COMMENTS

The Commission gives notice of your opportunity to submit written comments on the proposed rules. Written comments must be filed with the Commission no later than **5 p.m.**, **July 6, 2020**. Pursuant to WAC 480-07-250(3), written comments must be submitted in electronic form, specifically in searchable .pdf format (Adobe Acrobat or comparable software). As provided in WAC 480-07-140(5), those comments must be submitted via the Commission's web portal at www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing. If you are unable to submit documents via the portal, you may submit your comments by email to the Commission's Records Center at records@utc.wa.gov or by mailing or delivering an electronic copy to the Commission's Records Center on a flash drive, DVD, or compact disc that includes the filed document(s). Comment submissions should include:

- The docket numbers of this proceeding (Docket UE-190652);
- The commenting party's name, and

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• The title and date of the comment or comments.
