Northwest Natural Gas Company ("NNG") respectfully submits this Reply

Memorandum to respond to two issues raised in the Answer of Commission Staff to

NNG's Objection to Second Supplemental Order on Prehearing Conference ("Answer").

In its Answer, Commission Staff cites WAC 480-09-430(3) in support of its statement that: "By failing to appear at the February 15, 1996 prehearing conference, NNG has waived any objection to rulings arising out of the prehearing conference, including rulings on petitions to intervene." Commission Staff is incorrect. WAC 480-09-430(3) states that: "A party's failure to attend the conference, in the absence of a showing of good cause for that failure, will constitute the party's waiver of all objections to any order or ruling arising out of the conference...." (Emphasis added.) This rule applies only to a party's failure to attend the conference. Prior to the time when NNG's Petition to Intervene is granted, NNG is not a party to this proceeding. Accordingly, this rule simply does not apply and NNG's failure to attend the prehearing conference is not

a reason to deny its Petition to Intervene.

The reason that NNG desires to intervene in this case is that on many occasions in the past, other parties have asserted that decisions made and policies applied in proceedings involving other utilities in Washington must be applied to NNG, and negotiations on those issues have been difficult. Accordingly, NNG believed that it needed to intervene in this case in order to protect its ability to assert its views on issues that may arise and decisions that may be applied to NNG in the future.

Commission Staff states in its Answer:

"[A] rate case is <u>not</u> a rulemaking. The Commission has long recognized each company as separate and distinct from others in the same industry. Should NNG submit its own rate case, the Commission will determine the issues in a manner specific to NNG."

NNG would like to think that decisions made and policies applied in this case do not necessarily become policy for NNG, but our experience has demonstrated that a more active role in other LDC cases is warranted.

For the foregoing reasons, as well as the reasons stated in NNG's original objections, the Commission should reverse the order of the Administrative Law Judge and grant NNG's Petition to Intervene.
