**NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF PETITION FOR DECLARATORY ORDER
AND OPPORTUNITY TO SUBMIT STATEMENTS OF FACT AND LAW
(Due by Friday, December 6, 2013)**

RE: *In the Matter of the Petition of PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company
For a Declaratory Order Regarding the Interpretation of WAC 480-100-128(6)
and WAC 480-100-178, Docket UE-132119*

TO ALL PARTIES AND INTERESTED PERSONS:

On November 18, 2013, PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power & Light Company (PacifiCorp) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a Petition for a Declaratory Order (Petition) to clarify the interpretation of WAC 480-100-128(6) and WAC 480-100-178. Specifically, PacifiCorp requests that the Commission find that combining the first of four “past due” notices with regular billing statements complies with these Commission rules. A copy of the Petition is posted on the Commission’s web site at www.utc.wa.gov/132119.

Pursuant to RCW 34.05.240 and WAC 480-07-930, the Commission gives notice of PacifiCorp’s Petition to all persons required by law and other potentially interested persons. The Commission invites interested persons to submit a statement of fact and law on the issues raised by the Petition. Within thirty days of receiving the Petition, the Commission must either enter a declaratory order, notify PacifiCorp that no order will be entered, establish a date by which the Commission will enter an order, or set a date and time for a hearing.

NOTICE IS GIVEN That the Commission requests that interested persons who desire to be heard in this docket present a statement of fact and law on the issues raised in the Petition, including the applicability of Washington statutes and Commission rules to those issues. All persons interested in this matter must submit either a statement of fact and law or a request to be placed upon the Commission's service list in the event of further proceedings. All comments must be filed with the Commission no later than 5:00 p.m., Friday, December 6, 2013.
