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14 COMES NOW Asotin Telephone Company d/b/a TDS Telecom (the "Company") and,
15 pursuant to Chapter 480-123 of the Washington Administrative Code ("WAC") including, but not
16 limited to, WAC 480-123-110, hereby petitions the Washington Utilities and Transportation
17 Commission (the "Commission") to receive support from the State Universal Communications
18 Services Program established in RCW 80.36.650 (the "Program") for the Program year 2016.

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20 **I. Demonstration of Eligibility under WAC 480-123-100**

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22 1. WAC 480-123-100(1)(a): The Company is a local exchange company as defined in WAC
23 480-120-021 that serves less than forty thousand access lines within the state.

- 1 2. WAC 480-123-100(1)(b): The Company is an incumbent local exchange carrier as defined
2 in 47 U.S.C. Sec. 251(h).
- 3 3. WAC 480-123-100(1)(c): The Company offers basic residential and business exchange
4 telecommunications services as set forth in WAC 480-120-021 and RCW 80.36.630.
- 5 4. WAC 480-123-100(1)(d): The Company's rates for residential local exchange service, plus
6 mandatory extended area service charges, are no lower than the local urban rate floor
7 established by the Commission as the benchmark rate based on the Federal Communications
8 Commission's national local urban rate floor pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Sec. 54.318 in effect on
9 the date of this Petition.
- 10 5. WAC 480-123-100(1)(e): The Company has been designated by the Commission as an
11 eligible telecommunications carrier for purposes of receiving federal universal service
12 support pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Part 54 Subpart D - Universal Service Support for High Cost
13 Areas with respect to the service area for which the Company is seeking Program support.
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16 **II. Demonstration of Eligibility under WAC 480-123-110**

- 17 1. WAC 480-123-110(1)(a): The name of the legal entity that provides communications
18 services and is seeking Program support is as follows: Asotin Telephone Company d/b/a
19 TDS Telecom.

17 calculated in the manner prescribed by the Commission, is provided in Exhibit 4.

19 equity on a total company (regulated and non-regulated) Washington basis for the prior
20 year, calculated in the manner prescribed by the Commission, is provided in Exhibit 4.

- 15 13. WAC 480-123-110(1)(f): A complete copy of the FCC Form 481 filed by the Company or
16 on its behalf with the Federal Communications Commission for the calendar year preceding
17 the current year has already been filed with the Commission. See the Company's filing in
18 Docket No. UT-150063 filed on or about July 1, 2015.
- 19 14. WAC 480-123-110(1)(g): The number of residential local exchange access lines served by
20 the Company as of December 31, 2014, was 804, all of which were within the geographic

2 access lines served by the Company as of December 31, 2013, was 855, all of which were
3 within the geographic area for which the Company is seeking support. The number of
4 business local exchange access lines served by the Company as of December 31, 2014, was
5 160, all of which were within the geographic area for which the Company is seeking
6 support. The number of business local exchange access lines served by the Company as of
7 December 31, 2013, was 156, all of which were within the geographic area for which the
8 Company is seeking support. The monthly recurring rate charged by the Company for
9 residential local exchange access service on December 31, 2014, was \$16.20 and \$16.00 for
10 the exchanges of Asotin and Anatone respectively. The monthly recurring rate charged by
11 the Company for residential local exchange access service on December 31, 2013, was
12 \$16.20 and \$14.00 for the exchanges of Asotin and Anatone respectively. The rate charged
13 by the Company for single line business local exchange access service on December 31,
14 2014, was \$29.70 and \$19.70 for the exchanges of Asotin and Anatone respectively. The
15 rate charged by the Company for single line business local exchange access service on
16 December 31, 2013, was \$29.70 and \$19.70 for the exchanges of Asotin and Anatone
17 respectively. The Company has other business local exchange service rates, but the
18 Company understands that WAC 480-123-110(1)(g) is requesting the single line business
19 local exchange access service rate.
