Keep in mind that if using contractors you still must do a background check on each individual, unless you're using a service that provides temporary labor that does their own background checks. Additionally, if you're hiring your own subcontractors, make sure you're familiar with what makes a "contractor" in Washington state here. If you are personally present and directing the subcontractor, then they are not a contractor. An independent contractor is just that, independent, they are doing their own work with no direction from you. I would imagine when doing moves, this is not the case.
