

NOTICE: SPECIAL MEETING

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) will hold a special public meeting to review the electric least cost plan filed by Puget Sound Power & Light Company (Puget).

A "least cost plan" describes the mix of generation and supply resources and efficiency improvements which will meet both current and future energy demands at the lowest cost to the utility and its ratepayers. The "1992-1993 Integrated Resource Plan" is Puget's third published least cost plan, which is updated every two years.

THE PUBLIC IS INVITED TO COMMENT ON PUGET'S ELECTRIC LEAST COST PLAN AT A MEETING TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MAY 26, 1992. A DISCUSSION OF THE LEAST COST PLAN WILL COMMENCE AT 1:30 P.M. THE MEETING WILL BE HELD IN ROOM A, OVERLAKE HOSPITAL CONFERENCE CENTER, 1035 - 116TH AVENUE NE, BELLEVUE, WASHINGTON (206-462-5250).

Puget representatives will present the plan to the members of the Commission and will respond to questions from the commissioners and the public. A copy of the Puget electric least cost plan is on file in the Records Center of the Commission office in Olympia. The Commission will accept written comments on the Puget least cost plan in addition to oral comments made at the public meeting. A date for receiving written comments will be announced at the public meeting and a public notice confirming the date will be published by the Commission.
