Regularly **assess and understand** the potential risk in PSE's service territory—just as we do for all potential emergency situations




Prioritize and address highest risk through system hardening, vegetation management and increased situational awareness; take targeted operational actions when appropriate

PSE continues to evolve and implement real-time situational awareness tools to inform operational decisions


