TO ALL PARTIES:

On March 1, 2022, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) received a late-filed petition to intervene on behalf of the Fred Meyer Stores Inc. and Quality Food Centers, Divisions of The Kroger Co., (Kroger) in the above-referenced docket. Kroger states that as one of the largest commercial customers served by Puget Sound Energy (PSE), it has a substantial and vital interest in this proceeding and at present that interest is unrepresented by any party. Kroger states that it intends to address the issues of whether the revenue requirement, cost allocation, and rate design proposed by PSE are just and reasonable.
