NOTICE OF POTENTIAL EX PARTE COMMUNICATION

RE: Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission v. Puget Sound Energy, Dockets UE-220066 and UG-220067 (Consolidated)

TO ALL PARTIES:

Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 80.28.425(1) requires all electric and natural gas companies regulated by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) to include in every general rate case filing a proposal for a multiyear rate plan. The statute also requires the Commission to "conduct a proceeding to develop a policy statement addressing alternatives to traditional cost of service ratemaking, including performance measures or goals, targets, performance incentives, and penalty mechanisms." On October 11, 2021, the Commission initiated a proceeding as directed in Docket U-210590.

On January 31, 2022, Puget Sound Energy (PSE or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a general rate case in consolidated Dockets UE-220066 and UG-220067 that proposes a three-year rate plan consistent with RCW 80.28.425(1). When approving a multiyear rate plan, the Commission is required by statute to determine a set of performance measures that will be used to assess the utility's operations.¹

On February 11 and March 4, 2022, the Commission provided notice that it will convene a virtual workshop in Docket U-210590 on Tuesday, April 19, 2022, at 9:30 a.m. to begin discussing performance measures for regulated utilities.

Because performance measures will be addressed as part of the Commission's evaluation of PSE's proposed multiyear rate plan, the Commission issues this notice to invite all parties to

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PSE's general rate case to participate in the virtual workshop in Docket U-210590 to prevent any ex parte communication.
