RESPONSE OF COMMISSION STAFF TO KROGER'S LATE-FILED PETITION TO INTERVENE

(Kroger).

The Commission held a prehearing conference in the proceeding referenced above on February 28, 2022. On March 1, 2022, Kroger filed a Petition to Intervene in this proceeding. The following day, Kroger filed an Amended Late Filed Petition to Intervene.

Pursuant to the Commission's intervention rule, the presiding officer may grant a petition to intervene if the petitioner has a substantial interest in the subject matter of the proceeding or if the petitioner's participation is in the public interest. WAC 480-07-355(3). When a petition to intervene meets this standard but is made after the prehearing conference, the Commission may grant a petition to intervene made after the prehearing conference only on a showing of good cause, including a satisfactory explanation of why the person did not timely file a petition to intervene. WAC 480-07-355(1)(b).

In its Amended Late Filed Petition to Intervene, Kroger explains that the petition was filed late because Kroger did not become aware of the proceeding until Friday, February 25, 2022, and Kroger's counsel was not available then to review the case. The prehearing

conference commenced the following Monday morning at 9:30. Because Kroger states in its petition that it will accept the procedural schedule as is and because Staff believes the company meets the Commission's standard for intervention, Staff does not object to Kroger's late intervention.
