

Greenhouse gas, specifically CO<sub>2</sub>, is good. It is used in greenhouses to promote plant growth. Coal generating stations emit CO<sub>2</sub> into the atmosphere, which enhances agricultural plant growth, and provides no negative effects to humans.

Tremendous amounts of fossil energy are used in the mining, refining, and processing of materials required to make those things, and they don't last as long as coal stations.

Finally, coal generating stations provide stable baseload for the grid that wind generators and solar panels cannot. In summary, CETA requirements are entirely unreasonable and should be ignored and abolished.
