- 2 JUDGE MACE: Let's be on the record in Docket
- 3 Number UG-021584. This is the matter of the Petition of
- 4 Avista Utilities for Extension of the Natural Gas
- 5 Benchmark Mechanism. We are assembled here today at the
- 6 offices of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
- 7 Commission in Olympia, Washington on September 19th,
- 8 2003, for a pre-hearing conference. The purpose of the
- 9 conference is to mark exhibits and address any matters
- 10 preliminary to the evidentiary hearing which begins on
- 11 Monday, September 22nd. My name is Theodora Mace, I'm
- 12 the Administrative Law Judge who has substituted in for
- 13 Marjorie Schaer hearing this case. I would like to have
- 14 the oral appearances of counsel now beginning with the
- 15 applicant.
- MR. MEYER: Yes, Your Honor, appearing on
- 17 behalf of Avista is David Meyer, and would you like the
- 18 particulars or address, et cetera?
- JUDGE MACE: No, you have already entered
- 20 those, we don't need to have that again. Short form is
- 21 fine today.
- MR. MEYER: Thank you.
- MR. TROTTER: For the Commission, Donald T.
- 24 Trotter, Assistant Attorney General.
- 25 MR. CROMWELL: Robert Cromwell on behalf of

- 1 Public Counsel.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you.
- 3 I have passed out to the parties an agenda
- 4 that goes through several items that were raised in
- 5 documents that were supplied to me yesterday by counsel,
- 6 and we also have received the cross exhibits of the
- 7 parties, and we'll go through the exhibit list towards
- 8 the end I think.
- 9 But so let's see, is there anyone who has any
- 10 additions to this agenda?
- I would like to make one agenda item
- 12 addition, one addition to the agenda, and that is to
- 13 talk about the order of cross.
- 14 Is there anything else that we need to add to
- 15 this?
- 16 All right, so just to review the stipulation
- 17 of the Hirschkorn exhibits, I think that Staff might
- 18 have mentioned that in a letter yesterday.
- 19 MR. TROTTER: Yes.
- 20 JUDGE MACE: And as far as that's concerned,
- 21 if everyone agrees, that's fine. I do want to indicate,
- 22 as you see the note under number two, the Commissioners
- 23 may still have cross questions of Mr. Hirschkorn, and I
- 24 wanted to make sure you were aware of that. I'm
- assuming you intended to bring him to the hearing.

- 1 MR. MEYER: He will be here in any event,
- 2 yes.
- JUDGE MACE; Very well.
- 4 MR. TROTTER: I was making the offer to save
- 5 him a trip, so if he's here, then he can go on the stand
- 6 and make an offer, that's fine.
- JUDGE MACE: And then the third item,
- 8 Ms. Elder will be Tuesday afternoon.
- 9 MR. CROMWELL: Thank you.
- 10 JUDGE MACE: Everybody agrees to that
- 11 apparently.
- MR. MEYER: Yep.
- JUDGE MACE: That's fine.
- 14 And we have already received the replacement
- 15 sheets for the Elder testimony I believe.
- MR. CROMWELL: Yes, Your Honor.
- 17 JUDGE MACE: You supplied those earlier
- 18 today.
- 19 MR. CROMWELL: I have supplied clean copies.
- 20 I also have redlined versions for anyone. For the
- 21 record, there were I believe two typographical errors,
- 22 and then we wanted to clarify that Ms. Elder had used
- 23 the word Avista a number of times throughout about five
- 24 or six pages where it was perhaps more precise to say
- 25 Avista Energy, and I know the Chairwoman's preference

- 1 for specificity.
- JUDGE MACE: Right, so I have -- I'm sorry,
- 3 Mr. Trotter, did you --
- 4 MR. TROTTER: No.
- 5 JUDGE MACE: I have received those copies,
- 6 and we will just substitute the copies that you
- 7 provided. I don't really see a need for a redlined
- 8 version, as I indicated to you, for the Commissioners.
- 9 I think as long as the errors or the changes are
- 10 minimal, then it's not necessary.
- MR. TROTTER: Could we go back to item three?
- JUDGE MACE: Sure.
- 13 MR. TROTTER: I have no conceptual problem
- 14 with Ms. Elder testifying Tuesday afternoon. My only
- 15 concern is that we have some flexibility. I don't want
- 16 her to come in right in the middle of a Staff witness,
- 17 for example. So if it looks like we're about to start a
- 18 Staff witness -- is she going to be here in the morning?
- 19 MR. CROMWELL: I believe she's flying in
- Monday.
- MR. TROTTER: Okay.
- 22 MR. CROMWELL: So I'm hoping she will be here
- 23 Monday afternoon and that we could then substitute her
- 24 in any time Tuesday, perhaps after the conclusion of
- 25 cross of company witnesses. But if it looks like we are

- 1 not going to conclude the cross-examination of company
- 2 witnesses on Tuesday, I would ask that we take her out
- 3 of order in that sense so that we could get her on and
- 4 off the stand Tuesday.
- 5 MR. TROTTER: I don't have a problem with
- 6 that. I just, I think this probably goes to the company
- 7 too, but if she could go on Tuesday morning and that
- 8 would avoid going in the middle of anybody's other
- 9 witness, that would be preferred.
- 10 JUDGE MACE: Well, it seems like counsel are
- 11 willing to be flexible about that so that we can
- 12 schedule her in a way to avoid Mr. Trotter's concern and
- 13 also get Ms. Elder on and off in a timely fashion.
- MR. CROMWELL: Thank you.
- JUDGE MACE: The next item is number five,
- 16 Staff's request to take official notice of Avista's gas
- 17 integrated resource plans for 1997, 2000, and 2003. I'm
- 18 not in a position right now to take official notice,
- 19 because I think the commissioners would have to be with
- 20 me on the Bench in order to do that, but I wanted to
- 21 tell you that we will likely need to have copies of
- 22 that.
- MR. TROTTER: I actually do have them. I
- 24 forgot to hand them up.
- 25 JUDGE MACE: And you decided you didn't want

- 1 to make those exhibits?
- MR. TROTTER: Yeah, I'm sorry, they're here
- 3 on the trolley, I will just hand them to you.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Oh.
- 5 MR. TROTTER: I just have one to avoid
- 6 copying six, it will be like this thick, so I'm happy to
- 7 make multiple copies.
- JUDGE MACE: I see what you're saying.
- 9 MR. TROTTER: I have said in my letter I
- 10 would bring one of each for the parties and one for the
- 11 Bench. If you need more, we will expend the effort to
- 12 do that, but I do have them, I'm sorry.
- JUDGE MACE: All right, why don't you pass
- 14 those out right now. And this is all of them right
- 15 here?
- MR. TROTTER: That's right.
- JUDGE MACE: Okay, I will address this with
- 18 the commissioners to see whether they want to have
- 19 copies. My guess is the commissioners are going to want
- 20 to have copies, so you might want to bring an additional
- 21 two copies on Monday morning.
- MR. TROTTER: Okay.
- JUDGE MACE: If you would be so kind.
- 24 MR. TROTTER: And also if official notice is
- 25 not taken, could I reserve the right to have them marked

- 1 as exhibits for Mr. Norwood and we'll just --
- JUDGE MACE: Absolutely.
- 3 MR. TROTTER: -- go through and --
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Absolutely.
- 5 MR. TROTTER: -- ask questions about --
- 6 JUDGE MACE: It may be actually --
- 7 MR. TROTTER: -- what it says, but that's
- 8 basically all we would do.
- 9 JUDGE MACE: -- just an easier way to avoid
- 10 having that argument that will take up some -- I mean it
- 11 may not be an argument, but it will just take up some
- 12 time. If you have them marked as exhibits, then you can
- 13 just cross-examine on them.
- MR. TROTTER: Well, yeah.
- JUDGE MACE: Perhaps you had a different
- 16 idea.
- 17 MR. TROTTER: All the cross would be, doesn't
- 18 it say on page 10 what it says on page 10.
- 19 JUDGE MACE: Yes, we don't want to have that.
- 20 MR. TROTTER: So that's why I was going to
- 21 just do it by official notice or have them moved into
- 22 evidence by stipulation.
- JUDGE MACE: Okay, address it --
- MR. TROTTER: Either way.
- 25 JUDGE MACE: Let me do it this way. I will

- 1 try to check in with the commissioners this afternoon so
- 2 that you can, if necessary, avoid copying this document
- 3 again.
- 4 MR. TROTTER: Okay, that's fine, we're
- 5 willing to cooperate in any way you want.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: I have an order, I'm going to
- 7 skip number six, order of witnesses that I reflect in
- 8 number seven. Is the order going to be any different
- 9 than that? I recognize Ms. Elder may come slightly out
- 10 of order because we need to make sure that she gets
- 11 finished earlier on Tuesday. But other than that, is
- 12 there any change to the order of witnesses?
- I have tentatively indicated on my own notes,
- 14 I didn't put them on this piece of paper, an order of
- 15 cross calling for cross of Avista witnesses first by
- 16 Public Counsel, then by Staff. Is that a problem, or
- 17 did you want a different order?
- 18 MR. CROMWELL: I think we commonly have had
- 19 Staff go first. I'm happy to defer to Mr. Trotter.
- MR. TROTTER: That's fine.
- 21 JUDGE MACE: And then for the Staff witness,
- 22 I have Public Counsel and Avista.
- MR. CROMWELL: And at this time, I would not
- 24 anticipate any cross for Mr. Parvinen.
- JUDGE MACE: That's right, I think you

- 1 indicated that.
- 2 MR. CROMWELL: Yeah.
- JUDGE MACE: So it would be Avista.
- 4 And then for Public Counsel I guess it's just
- 5 Avista, so that solves that problem, okay.
- 6 MR. MEYER: May I just make the usual
- 7 reservation of our right, because we are putting our
- 8 witnesses' direct and rebuttal testimony in at the same
- 9 time, they will be up and then down, to reserve the
- 10 right, which we have seldom exercised, but just in the
- 11 event that there's some issues that require some
- 12 rebuttal, to represent the witness on the stand after
- 13 Staff or Public Counsel if there are some items that
- 14 need to be addressed by way of further rebuttal. It
- 15 doesn't often happen, but I just want to, in view of the
- 16 fact that we are bunching together our direct and our
- 17 rebuttal testimony and just getting it done and getting
- 18 it said up front.
- JUDGE MACE: Well, you know, you're aware of
- 20 all the testimony at this point. You're certainly
- 21 welcome to make that request on the record. I can't
- 22 tell you what the answer would be.
- MR. MEYER: I understand, I just didn't want
- 24 you to be surprised. And we're not anticipating the
- 25 need to do that, as I say, we have seldom exercised

- 1 that, but I just wanted to bring that to your attention.
- 2 JUDGE MACE: Make sure you mention it on the
- 3 record while the Commissioners are here.
- 4 MR. MEYER: Yes.
- 5 JUDGE MACE: It would be good to do.
- 6 Let's briefly look at the cross grid. On my
- 7 own copy I have indicated that Staff E-mailed me with a
- 8 notification they're going to add -- they want to add 15
- 9 minutes to their cross of each of the three company
- 10 witnesses they're crossing. So by my calculation we
- 11 have approximately 11 hours of cross. We have only two
- 12 days for hearing, and I'm sure the Commissioners are
- 13 going to want to make it fit, so we may be going longer
- 14 if for some reason we don't move as expeditiously
- 15 through this list as we might otherwise. So I just want
- 16 to make sure you're aware that sometimes cross is
- 17 shorter too, and if you can shorten your cross, I'm sure
- 18 the Commissioners would appreciate it, particularly if,
- 19 you know, you don't want to be repeating questions. You
- 20 already know all this, I don't have to talk to you about
- 21 it I'm sure.
- MR. CROMWELL: Your Honor, one question.
- JUDGE MACE: Yes.
- 24 MR. CROMWELL: Is Wednesday afternoon still
- 25 potentially available?

- 1 JUDGE MACE: No.
- MR. CROMWELL: I guess in that event, if by
- 3 the end of the day Monday it looks like we are not on
- 4 pace, I would ask that we perhaps go longer both days
- 5 rather than end up in the situation where we're stuck
- 6 here Tuesday until the light dawns again on Wednesday.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: Surely. I have been in that
- 8 situation lately, but I just -- we need to talk about
- 9 that with the Commissioners present, because it does
- 10 depend on their schedule as well. So we could talk
- 11 about it, see how things go, and certainly bring it up
- 12 if it looks like we're not moving very quickly and see
- 13 if we can go longer both days. I can't give you an
- 14 answer right now.
- 15 MR. CROMWELL: I would ask that perhaps you
- 16 raise that with them if you have the opportunity.
- JUDGE MACE: Okay, so let's turn to the
- 18 exhibit list. You will see on page 1 for Mr. Norwood I
- 19 eliminated Staff cross 1 arbitrarily. I don't know that
- 20 that was one of the ones you asked to have eliminated,
- 21 but I noticed that it appeared to be a duplicate of
- 22 another exhibit.
- MR. TROTTER: And I did check, and it was
- 24 duplicative of Public Counsel's cross number 6, which
- 25 you identified as Number 12, so we'll just refer to that

- 1 version.
- JUDGE MACE: All right. So then I also
- 3 understand from your e-mail today that you are
- 4 eliminating from your list of cross exhibits, Staff
- 5 Cross 3 for Mr. Norwood, Staff Cross 4, and Staff Cross
- 6 5, which are 15, 16, and 17. Is that right?
- 7 MR. TROTTER: Yeah, those are DR's 115, 118,
- 8 and 119.
- 9 JUDGE MACE: So that when I send you the
- 10 revised list, those will be eliminated.
- 11 I also understand, going to Mr. Gruber's list
- 12 of exhibits that you are eliminating Staff Cross 1 and
- 13 Staff Cross 2. Those are Avista responses to Staff
- 14 Request 120 and 121 and are marked as 62 and 63.
- MR. TROTTER: That is correct.
- JUDGE MACE: Does anybody have any other
- 17 changes or corrections to this list?
- MR. CROMWELL: Yes.
- 19 JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- 20 MR. CROMWELL: Just for convenience of the
- 21 record, I think if we go to Mr. Gruber starting at 55,
- 22 and I haven't gone back and checked the testimonies, but
- 23 I think 55 should be 55C.
- JUDGE MACE: That's correct.
- MR. CROMWELL: 57 should be 57C.

- 1 JUDGE MACE: Thank you.
- 2 MR. CROMWELL: Going to Mr. D'Arienzo, 103
- 3 should be 103C.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Thank you.
- 5 MR. CROMWELL: 109 should be 109C, and 111
- 6 should be 111C. Those were just sort of my off the cuff
- 7 notes.
- JUDGE MACE: That's good.
- 9 MR. CROMWELL: I haven't looked at Staff DR's
- 10 or the company testimony to see whether I have missed
- 11 any other confidential documents that should have that
- 12 designation on the exhibit list.
- 13
 JUDGE MACE: I'm just looking right now at
- 14 Ms. Elder's exhibits, and it looks like her direct
- 15 Exhibits 252 -- well, no, that's the CV. 253 should be
- 16 a confidential exhibit, 254, 257, 258. I think that's
- 17 it.
- MR. CROMWELL: Exactly.
- JUDGE MACE: Anybody notice anything else?
- 20 Some of this we can correct.
- MR. TROTTER: Yes, Your Honor, on
- 22 Mr. Parvinen's list you do MPP-1T through MPP-11, and we
- 23 did have an MPP-12.
- JUDGE MACE: Oh.
- 25 MR. TROTTER: I think it was omitted on the

- 1 original distribution, and then I think we followed up
- 2 the next day or the same day, I can't remember, but it
- 3 is an analysis of capacity release and off-system sales
- 4 revenues. It was distributed at the same time, but for
- 5 some reason it's not on your list.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: You wouldn't happen to have an
- 7 extra copy of it, would you? If you would bring an
- 8 extra copy on Monday.
- 9 MR. MEYER: We have an extra copy here just
- 10 because we have extra copies.
- 11 JUDGE MACE: Just because I'm concerned that
- 12 -- I'm not sure why I don't have it listed. It might be
- 13 because somehow I failed to put it into my book. Let's
- 14 deal with it on Monday, because I may have a copy.
- MR. MEYER: Okay.
- 16 JUDGE MACE: I will just look again.
- MR. MEYER: Sure.
- 18 JUDGE MACE: All right, thank you, so that
- 19 will become 212, and then I will move the other one, I
- 20 will change the order so that it includes this exhibit.
- 21 So you noticed that I marked the exhibits,
- 22 and that would be the order that I propose or the
- 23 marking that I propose. Does anybody have any other
- 24 comments or suggestions about the exhibits?
- Then I don't have anything else. I could

- 1 tell you the usual things. Try not to talk over each
- 2 other or the witnesses so that the reporter can record
- 3 all the -- make all of the record. And address your
- 4 comments to me rather than other counsel. I can't
- 5 really think of anything else. If you have any
- 6 concerns, you're welcome to raise them on Monday when we
- 7 begin, or I will be here a few minutes early, and you
- 8 can talk to me about them.
- 9 Then we're adjourned, thank you.
- 10 (Hearing adjourned at 9:45 a.m.)
