**MEMORANDUM**

*1* **PROCEEDINGS:** This matter involves a private party complaint, or in the alternative, a petition for a declaratory order, filed by Waste Connections of Washington, Inc. (Waste Connections) against Enviro/Con & Trucking, Inc. (ECTI) and Waste Management Disposal Services of Oregon, Inc. (Waste Management).<sup>1</sup> On April 22, 2008, the Commission entered its Initial Order granting Respondents’ Motion for Summary Determination. The Initial Order, if it becomes final following review or by operation of law, would dismiss Waste Connections of Washington, Inc.’s, Complaint because the relief requested—that Respondents cease collecting and transporting certain waste—has already been realized in fact, there would be no practical value in determining in the context of a private party dispute that Respondents required a certificate to conduct the activities that now are concluded, and the matter is not one that falls within the public interest exception for cases that otherwise are moot.

<sup>1</sup> The original complaint included Envirocon, Inc., as a Respondent. However, on further investigation, Complainant filed a motion for voluntary dismissal and the Commission entered Order 02 dismissing Envirocon, Inc.

- 2 On May 2, 2008, Waste Connections of Washington, Inc. (Waste Connections), filed its Motion for Extension of Time for Filing Petition for Administrative Review from May 13, 2008, until May 30, 2008. Waste Connections states that its attorney's travel schedule and obligations in other proceedings preclude filing within the usual timeframe. Respondents filed a letter on May 5, 2008, stating they do not object to the request for extension of time. According to the motion, neither of the intervenors in this proceeding objects to the proposed extension.
- 3 The Commission finds Waste Connections shows good cause to extend the time available for filing of any petitions for administrative review. Parties may submit any petition for administrative review via the Commission's web portal or e-mail with electronic service on other parties no later than May 30, 2008, followed by paper service postmarked on the date of submission. Parties must ensure that the Commission receives paper filings the following business day.

**ORDER**

THE COMMISSION ORDERS That Waste Connection's Motion for Extension of Time for Filing Petition for Administrative Review from May 13, 2008, until May 30, 2008, is granted. Submission, filing and service are to be effected as provided in the body of this Order.
