1 On March 31, 2003, Timberline Village Water Company, Inc. filed with the Commission certain tariff revisions designed to effect a general rate increase in its rates for water services in this state. It is indicated that the total effect of such tariff revisions is an increase of approximately \$53,651.00 (119%) annually. The operation of such tariff revisions has been suspended by order of the Commission pending hearing or hearings concerning such changes and the justness and reasonableness thereof.

2 Hearing in this matter is being held pursuant to Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW pertaining to adjudicative proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within chapter 80.01 RCW, chapter 80.04 RCW, chapter 80.12 RCW, chapter 80.16 RCW, and chapter 80.28 RCW including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.04.130, RCW 80.04.250, RCW 80.16.020 through RCW 80.16.050, RCW 80.28.010, RCW 80.28.020, RCW 80.28.030, RCW 80.28.040, and RCW 80.28.100. Rules involved include those within chapter 480-09 WAC, chapter 480-146 WAC and chapter 480-110 WAC. The ultimate issues involved are: 1) whether the tariff revisions to increase the amount collected are just and reasonable; 2) whether existing rates are fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient; and 3) whether the purity, volume, and pressure of water supplied is sufficient, pure, or adequate. The issue as to the justness and reasonableness of the rates includes consideration of alternative rate design or structure. Included within the consideration of alternative rate design is the validity and continuity of any water service provided under contract. In accordance with the provisions of RCW

80.04.130 the burden of proof to show that the increase is just and reasonable will be upon the respondent.

3 **NOTICE IS GIVEN That a prehearing conference will be held on August 4, 2003, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.**

4 The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider formulating the issues in the proceeding, and to determine other matters to aid in its disposition, as specified in WAC 480-09-460. Petitions to intervene should be made in writing prior to the prehearing conference or made orally at that time. The time and place for the evidentiary hearing will be set at the prehearing conference or by later written notice. Appearances will be taken.

5 If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, please fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission.

6 NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN THAT ANY PARTY WHO FAILS TO ATTEND OR PARTICIPATE IN THE HEARING SET BY THIS NOTICE, OR ANY OTHER STAGE OF THIS PROCEEDING, MAY BE HELD IN DEFAULT IN ACCORDANCE WITH RCW 34.05.440. THE PARTIES ARE FURTHER ADVISED THAT THE SANCTION PROVISIONS OF WAC 480-09-700(4) ARE SPECIFICALLY INVOKED.
