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- 2 JUDGE MACE: Let's be on the record in Docket
- 3 No. TC-051121. This is the Washington Utilities and
- 4 Transportation Commission complaint against Pennco
- 5 Transportation Inc. This is in the nature of a
- 6 show-cause hearing, why Pennco Transportation's
- 7 certificate should not be canceled for discontinuance
- 8 of service without permission from the Commission and
- 9 for failure to file 2004 annual report and failure to
- 10 file 2005 regulatory fees.
- 11 This hearing is being convened on August
- 12 31st, 2005, at three p.m. at the offices of the
- 13 Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission in
- 14 Olympia, Washington. My name is Theodora Mace. I'm
- 15 the administrative law judge who has been assigned to
- 16 this case.
- 17 I would like to ask now if there is anyone on
- 18 the conference bridge. After I take your appearance,
- 19 I'm just going to call and check to make sure that it
- 20 is on. So let me begin with an appearance from
- 21 Commission staff.
- MR. THOMPSON: I'm Jonathan Thompson,
- 23 assistant attorney general, representing the
- 24 Commission. Would you like a full form of appearance?
- JUDGE MACE: Yes.

- 1 MR. THOMPSON: My street address is 1400
- 2 South Evergreen Park Drive Southwest. My PO Box is
- 3 40128, and that's Olympia, Washington, 98504. My phone
- 4 number is (360) 664-1225. Fax is (360) 586-5522.
- 5 E-mail is jonat@atg.wa.gov, or, jthompso@wutc.wa.gov.
- 6 JUDGE MACE: Thank you. I'm going to take a
- 7 brief recess while I check to make sure the conference
- 8 bridge is connected so that in case Pennco is making an
- 9 appearance by telephone, we will be able to take that
- 10 appearance. Excuse me for a moment.
- 11 (Discussion off the record.)
- 12 JUDGE MACE: Let the record show that the
- 13 administrative law judge figured out how to connect to
- 14 the conference bridge and has asked whether there is
- 15 anyone who seeks to enter an appearance via the
- 16 conference bridge and has received no response, so it
- 17 appears that at the present time, there is no one who
- 18 has appeared on behalf of Pennco Transportation, Inc.,
- 19 at this show-cause hearing.
- I would like to give, I believe it would be
- 21 Mr. Harris from Pennco, I would like to give someone
- 22 from Pennco an opportunity to show up or to call in, so
- 23 I'm going to give them until about 20 after three.
- 24 That's another ten minutes. If you would just bear
- 25 with me, those of you who are hear in the hearing room,

- 1 and then we will go ahead with the hearing. We are
- 2 adjourned for ten minutes.
- 3 (Discussion off the record.)
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Let's be back on the record in
- 5 Docket No. TC-051121. Let me ask at this point if
- 6 anyone has come onto the conference bridge. Is there
- 7 anyone on the conference bridge? Let the record show I
- 8 hear no response. At this point, I think we can go
- 9 ahead with the presentation of the information that
- 10 Staff has about this respondent, and so Mr. Thompson,
- 11 I'll turn it over to you.
- MR. THOMPSON: Staff will be calling Betty
- 13 Young to offer some testimony on the elements that were
- 14 set out in the Commission's notice.
- JUDGE MACE: Please stand and raise your
- 16 right hand.
- 17 (Witness sworn.)
- 18
- 19 DIRECT EXAMINATION
- 20 BY MR. THOMPSON:
- Q. Ms. Young, will you please state your full
- 22 name and spell it for the record?
- A. My name is Betty Young, B-e-t-t-y, Y-o-u-n-g.
- Q. What is your position with the Washington
- 25 Utilities and Transportation Commission?

- 1 A. I'm a compliance specialist with the business
- 2 practices investigation.
- Q. What are your responsibilities as they
- 4 pertain to this matter?
- 5 A. I conduct investigations into the business
- 6 practices of regulated utility and transportation
- 7 companies. As part of those duties, I investigate
- 8 companies that are delinquent in filing annual reports
- 9 and paying regulatory fees and/or violate Commission
- 10 rules regarding cessation of service.
- 11 Q. What is your testimony going to cover this
- 12 afternoon?
- 13 A. I'm going to testify about Pennco
- 14 Transportation, Inc.'s failure to comply with
- 15 Commission rules regarding annual reports and
- 16 regulatory fees and its failure to obtain the
- 17 Commission's permission to cease providing service
- 18 under its certificate, which is number C-1054.
- 19 Q. Could you please just explain briefly what
- 20 the requirements are for auto transportation companies
- 21 with respect to annual reports and regulatory fees?
- 22 A. Yes. Auto transportation companies subject
- 23 to regulation by the Commission are required to file
- 24 annual reports, and that's per WAC 480-30-120, and pay
- 25 a regulatory fee every year. The annual report details

- 1 the gross intrastate operating revenue for the company
- 2 for the preceding calendar year. Regulatory fees based
- 3 on that revenue are collected for the current year, and
- 4 that's per RCW 81.21.020.
- 5 Q. When are regulatory fees and annual reports
- 6 due for auto transportation companies?
- 7 A. Regulatory fees must be paid and the annual
- 8 reports must be filed by May 1st each year, and that's
- 9 per WAC 480-30-110 and 480-30-120.
- 10 Q. How does the Commission inform companies that
- 11 its reports and fees are due?
- 12 A. The Commission's licensing services section
- 13 mails annual report forms and regulatory fee packets to
- 14 auto transportation companies in Washington every year.
- 15 A letter signed by Executive Secretary Carol Washburn
- 16 instructs companies to file those by May 1st.
- 17 Q. Do you have a copy of the letter that would
- 18 have been sent to Pennco Transportation?
- 19 A. Yes, I do.
- 20 Q. And that is what's been marked as Exhibit 1?
- JUDGE MACE: You can have these back.
- 22 (Indicating.)
- Q. And is this a true and correct copy of that
- 24 letter?
- 25 A. Yes, it is.

- 1 MR. THOMPSON: Staff would offer what's been
- 2 marked as Exhibit 1 for admission.
- JUDGE MACE: I'll admit it.
- 4 Q. (By Mr. Thompson) Did Pennco file a 2004
- 5 annual report or pay its 2005 regulatory fees?
- 6 A. No, it did not.
- 7 Q. Did the Company seek an extension?
- 8 A. No.
- 9 Q. Did the Commission follow-up in any way on
- 10 Pennco's failure to do those two things?
- 11 A. Yes. On June 1st, licensing services staff
- 12 sent a letter again signed by Carol Washburn to each
- 13 auto transportation company that had not filed by
- 14 May 1st. The letter stated that Staff intended to
- 15 recommend enforcement action, including possible
- 16 penalties and/or suspension or revocation of the
- 17 company's authority or for any company that failed to
- 18 file a completed annual report or pay the regulatory
- 19 fee by July 1st, 2005.
- 20 Q. Do you have a copy of that letter?
- 21 A. Yes, I do.
- 22 Q. Is what's been marked as Exhibit 2 a true and
- 23 correct copy of that letter?
- 24 A. Yes, it is.
- MR. THOMPSON: Staff would offer Exhibit 2

- 1 for admission.
- JUDGE MACE: I'll admit that.
- 3 Q. (By Mr. Thompson) Did Pennco pay its fees or
- 4 file its annual report as directed by that letter?
- 5 A. No, it did not.
- 6 Q. And it still has not done so?
- 7 A. No, it hasn't.
- 8 Q. Now let's turn to the matter of the Company
- 9 ceasing service without permission of the Commission.
- 10 Can you explain briefly what the Commission's
- 11 requirements are with regard to auto transportation
- 12 companies ceasing to provide service?
- 13 A. Yes. Commission rules require auto
- 14 transportation companies to formally notify the
- 15 Commission prior to discontinuing service and to obtain
- 16 the Commission's permission to do so, and that's per
- 17 WAC 480-30-060.
- 18 Q. What's your understanding about whether
- 19 Pennco is providing service currently?
- 20 A. It's my understanding that they are not
- 21 currently operating.
- 22 Q. Can you just briefly explain the
- 23 circumstances surrounding Pennco ceasing to provide
- 24 service earlier this year?
- 25 A. Yes. The Commission received notice on March

- 1 22nd, 2005, that insurance coverage for Pennco would be
- 2 canceled effective April 23rd, 2005. Licensing
- 3 services staff sent notice to the Company that Pennco
- 4 needed to file proof of insurance coverage with the
- 5 Commission on or before April 23rd or the Company's
- 6 operating authority would be suspended.
- 7 Pennco did not submit proof of insurance by
- 8 April 23rd. The Commission then suspended Pennco's
- 9 certificate to insure that the Company was not hauling
- 10 passengers without proper insurance. Then on May 4th,
- 11 2005, the Commission received an insurance binder for
- 12 Pennco and issued an order lifting that suspension,
- 13 allowing Pennco to resume operating.
- 14 Q. Did the Commission notify Pennco at that time
- 15 that it was free to resume providing service?
- 16 A. Yes. The Commission mailed an order lifting
- 17 the suspension effective May 4th, 2005.
- 18 Q. And that order has been premarked as
- 19 Exhibit 3?
- 20 A. Yes.
- 21 MR. THOMPSON: Although it's a Commission
- 22 order, we'll offer that as well.
- JUDGE MACE: I'll admit Exhibit 3.
- 24 Q. (By Mr. Thompson) Did the Commission receive
- 25 any communications from Pennco's owner, Mr. Harris,

- 1 regarding the Company ceasing to provide service?
- 2 A. Yes. The Commission received two letters
- 3 from Mr. Harris referencing cessation of Pennco's
- 4 operation. One was a letter to Carol Washburn dated
- 5 May 9th, 2005, and the second was a letter to Judge
- 6 Mace on May 31st, in the context of a separate docket
- 7 number.
- 8 Q. And the May 9th Carol Washburn letter is
- 9 marked as Exhibit 4. Is that a true and correct copy?
- 10 A. Yes, it is.
- 11 Q. And the letter to Judge Mace is marked as
- 12 Exhibit 5?
- 13 A. Yes.
- 14 Q. That's a true and correct copy?
- 15 A. Yes, it is.
- 16 MR. THOMPSON: We would offer Exhibits 4 and
- 17 5 for the record.
- JUDGE MACE: I'll admit them.
- 19 Q. (By Mr. Thompson) Did the Commission advise
- 20 Mr. Harris of the need to get its permission prior to
- 21 ceasing to provide service?
- 22 A. Yes. Mr. Harris was actually notified on two
- 23 separate occasions. On June 24th, 2005, Commission
- 24 staff Bonnie Allen testified in Docket TC-041340 that
- 25 Mr. Harris had contacted her and that she had informed

- 1 him of WAC 480-30-060, which requires auto
- 2 transportation companies to get the Commission's
- 3 permission prior to discontinuing service.
- 4 Also on July 6th, 2005, Carol Washburn sent
- 5 Mr. Harris a letter advising that Commission rules
- 6 require auto transportation companies to formally
- 7 notify the Commission prior to discontinuing service
- 8 and to formally obtain the Commission's permission for
- 9 the discontinuance. Mr. Harris was directed to respond
- 10 by July 13th, 2005, with a written request to
- 11 discontinue service or a request for a waiver of the
- 12 rule requirement.
- 13 Q. Is what's been marked as Exhibit 6 a copy of
- 14 that letter from Carol Washburn dated July 6th?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. Is it a true and correct copy?
- 17 A. Yes, it is.
- 18 MR. THOMPSON: We would offer what's been
- 19 marked as Exhibit 6.
- JUDGE MACE: I'll admit it.
- 21 Q. (By Mr. Thompson) Did Mr. Harris respond as
- 22 directed in that letter?
- 23 A. No, he did not.
- Q. And have you done anything personally to
- 25 determine if Pennco is currently operating?

- 1 A. I attempted to contact the Company by phone.
- 2 The phone number is listed here at the Commission.
- 3 Those numbers are 1-888-673-6626 and (360) 582-3736, on
- 4 July 19th, and at that time, there was a recording on
- 5 the line that stated the number had been temporarily
- 6 disconnected. I called those two numbers again
- 7 yesterday, and the recording has been changed to
- 8 reflect that the numbers have been discontinued and are
- 9 no longer in service.
- 10 Q. Are those the numbers that are reflected on
- 11 the Company's tariffs as well?
- 12 A. Yes.
- MR. THOMPSON: That's all the questions I
- 14 have for Ms. Young.
- JUDGE MACE: Thank you very much. You are
- 16 excused.
- 17 MR. THOMPSON: I guess I would conclude by
- 18 saying that the basis for Staff's case is as set out,
- 19 essentially, in the Commission's notice. We are
- 20 relying primarily on RCW 81.68.030, which says that the
- 21 Commission may revoke a certificate if it is shown that
- 22 the holder willfully violates or refuses to observe any
- 23 of the Commission's proper rules, and the testimony has
- 24 demonstrated that the Company had ample notice and
- 25 repeated notice of the requirements of the rules

- 1 regarding annual reports and regulatory fees but has
- 2 not complied with those, as we will as the rule
- 3 regarding obtaining the Commission's permission for
- 4 cessation of service. So we would respectfully request
- 5 that the Commission revoke Pennco Transportation's
- 6 authority under Certificate C-1054 on that basis.
- 7 JUDGE MACE: I just want to make sure that
- 8 we've covered every base. The caption of the case
- 9 talks about a show-cause for why the certificate should
- 10 not be canceled. There is no difference between
- 11 cancellation and revocation. You are requesting
- 12 revocation. Is it the same thing?
- MR. THOMPSON: Yes, I believe it is.
- 14 Actually, the statute uses the term "suspend, revoke,
- 15 alter, or amend, " and I think probably "cancel" is just
- 16 synonymous with "revoke."
- JUDGE MACE: Just so I touch on that. All
- 18 right. Well, it shouldn't be too long before I enter
- 19 an order, and if there is nothing else, then thank you.
- 20 The record is closed.
- 21 (Show-cause hearing concluded at 3:33 p.m.)

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
