BACKGROUND

- On June 1, 2009, First Communications. LLC (FirstCom or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition for an extension of time to file its annual report for 2008 as required by WAC 480-120-382. According to FirstCom, it is unable to prepare the report due to the fact that the Company's audit will not be completed until later this month. FirstCom seeks an extension until July 1, 2009.
- 2 Commission Staff reviewed the request and recommended granting FirstCom's request for exemption.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate public service companies, including competitively classified telecommunications companies. *RCW* 80.01.040, *RCW* 80.04 and *RCW* 80.36.
- 4 (2) FirstCom is a competitively classified telecommunications company and a public service company subject to Commission jurisdiction.
- 5 (3) FirstCom is subject to WAC 480-120-382, which requires competitively classified telecommunications companies to file an annual report no later than May 1 of each year.

- 6 (4) Under WAC 480-120-015, the Commission may grant an exemption from any rule in WAC 480-120, if consistent with the public interest, the purposes underlying regulation and applicable statutes. *See also WAC 480-07-110*.
- 7 (5) This matter came before the Commission at its regularly scheduled meeting on June 11, 2009.
- After review of the petition in Docket UT-090511 by FirstCom filed on June 1, 2009, and giving due consideration, the Commission finds that the exemption is in the public interest and is consistent with the purposes underlying the regulation and applicable statutes and should be granted.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 9 (1) The request by First Communications. LLC for an exemption from WAC 480-120-382 and for an extension until July 1, 2009, to file its 2008 annual report is granted.
- 10 (2) Failure by First Communications. LLC to file its annual report by July 1, 2009, may result in the Commission invoking RCW 80.04.405, which allows the Commission to assess penalties for violations of statute, rules and Commission orders.
- 11 (3) The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and First Communications. LLC to effectuate the provisions of this Order.

The Commissioners, having determined this Order to be consistent with the public interest, directed the Executive Director and Secretary to enter this Order.
