1 On May 13, 2009, Miller Schmer, Inc., d/b/a Seattle Express, filed application in accordance with RCW 81.68 for extension of service under Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity C-1052 to furnish passenger service as follows:

Changing from Terminal 30 to Terminal 91

2 Subsequently, on June 2, 2009, interested parties were notified of the application to give them an opportunity to express their views. The application is unopposed.

3 In support of the authority requested, applicant provided several letters from members of the public who live in the communities involved. Their letters indicate a need of service which is currently not served on the route.

4 The Commission finds that the applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly conduct the proposed operation and it appears that the service sought to be rendered is necessary and will be a convenience to the public.

5 After reviewing the evidence submitted and due to the fact that no service of an existing nature is presently available over this route, the Commission will issue the requested authority.

**ORDER**

6 THE COMMISSION ORDERS That application Docket TC-090731 is hereby granted, conditioned upon compliance with the laws and rules governing auto transportation companies, and that Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity C-1052 is amended to read as follows:

PASSENGER SERVICE

BETWEEN: Hotels in the City of Renton and the Pike Place Market in downtown Seattle.

BETWEEN: Hotels in the City of Sea-Tac, South Center Mall, Pike Place Market and Cruise Terminals #66 and #91.

BETWEEN: Hotels in the City of Tukwila, South Center Mall, Pike Place Market, and Cruise Terminals #66 and #91.

7 The Commission further orders that the tariff and time schedule filed in connection with this application will become effective at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the service date of this order.

8 The Commission has delegated authority to the Secretary to enter this Order under RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-905(6)(a).

**NOTICE:** This is an order delegated to the Secretary for decision. In addition to serving you a copy of the decision, the Commission will post on its Internet Web site for at least 14 days a listing of all matters delegated to the Secretary for decision. You may seek Commission review of this decision. You must file a request for Commission review of this order no later than fourteen (14) days after the date the decision is posted on the Commission's Web site.

The Commission will schedule your request for review by issuing a notice of hearing to be held before an administrative law judge. The Commission, at its discretion, may consider your request for review in an adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05 Part IV, or in a brief adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05.482 through .494. Following hearing, the administrative law judge will enter an initial order. If you wish to seek review of the initial order, you may file a petition for administrative review under RCW 34.05.464, or if the matter is heard in a brief adjudicative proceeding, under RCW 34.05.491.

The Commission will grant a late-filed request for review only on a showing of good cause, including a satisfactory explanation of why the person did not timely file the request. A form for late-filed requests is available on the Commission's Web site.

This notice and review process is pursuant to the provisions of RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-904(2) and (3), and WAC 480-07-905, as amended effective September 22, 2008.
