## Recommendation

Issue a Complaint and Order Suspending the Tariff Revisions filed by Washington Water Service Company, in Docket UW-180592.

#### **Discussion**

On July 2, 2018, Washington Water Service Company (Washington Water or company), filed with the Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) a proposed general rate increase that would generate \$1.6 million (13.8 percent) additional annual revenue. The company's reason for the increase is many operating costs and also address recent tax issues due to the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017. The proposed effective date is August 1, 2018. The company serves approximately 17,500 residential customers on 196 water systems located in eight counties. The company's last rate increase was effective February 1, 2015, and would generate approximately \$1.66 million (17.5 percent) additional annual revenue.

#### **Customer Comments**

On July 2, 2018, the company notified its customers of the proposed rate increase by mail. The commission received 31 comments opposed to the increase.
