COMES NOW, MURREY’S DISPOSAL COMPANY, INC. (“Murrey’s”), Certificate  
G-0009 and HAROLD LeMAY ENTERPRISES, INC. (“LeMay”), Certificate G-98 or  
“Protestants,” by and through its counsel, David W. Wiley of Williams, Kastner & Gibbs  
PLLC, 601 Union Street, Suite 4100, Seattle, Washington, 98101, (206) 233-2895, and  
pursuant to WAC 480-70-106(2), protest the above-entitled solid waste certificate application  
which seeks authority for:

Solid waste container drop off and collection service consisting of solid waste  
from King, Pierce and Thurston Counties to recycling centers and transfer  
stations in King, Pierce and Thurston Counties.

This protest is submitted on the following grounds:

I.

Murrey’s is the holder and operator of Solid Waste Certificate G-0009, attached hereto  
as Exhibit A and LeMay is the holder and operator of Solid Waste Certificate G-98, attached as

1 Exhibit B. As said exhibits indicate, Protestants currently holds authority in conflict with and  
2 which overlap the applied-for solid waste container authority as noted above.

3 II.

4 Protestants, as the holders of an overlapping solid waste certificates, therefore allege  
5 they have a direct, cognizable interest in this proceeding adverse to this application, and further  
6 allege that the applicant is unable to establish it will not provide service to the satisfaction of the  
7 Commission, that the applicant is fit, willing and able to provide the proposed service, and/or that  
8 the applicant's service is required by the present or future public convenience and necessity, as  
9 mandated by RCW 81.77.040.

10 III.

11 Pursuant to the authority under permanent solid waste certificates, Protestants are ready,  
12 willing and able to provide all of the collection and transportation services to the generating public  
13 sought by applicant. Protestants have invested millions of dollars in the provision of solid waste  
14 service within Pierce and Thurston Counties. The regulated solid waste collection service  
15 proposed by applicant is not required by the public convenience and necessity, is not to  
16 Protestants' knowledge a recognized component of the local solid waste management plan  
17 adopted in Pierce and Thurston Counties, and would duplicate and/or increase the cost of offering  
18 a broad range of services to all classes of customers by Protestants, and is therefore contrary to the  
19 public interest.

20 IV.

21 Moreover, as alluded to in paragraph II, above, Protestants allege that this applicant cannot  
22 establish its fitness to conduct operations, its past or future compliance with Washington law and  
23 rule, and/or that its service would be consistent with the public interest or required by the present  
24 or future public convenience and necessity under RCW 81.77.040.

1 Protestants testify that they will appear at any hearing on this matter and will present  
2 evidence through approximately two witnesses, requiring an estimated hearing time of two to  
3 three hours.

4  
5 WHEREFORE, Murrey's and LeMay, Protestants herein, pray that their right to  
6 participate in the entirety of Application TG-200250 be fully affirmed, are currently unaware of  
7 any restrictive amendment which would or could satisfy their interest herein, and therefore ask  
8 that Application No. TG-200250 of ADE Dumpsters LLC be denied in its entirety.


