I. PARTIES

1 This Settlement Agreement (Settlement) is entered into by Murrey's Disposal Company, Inc. ("Murrey's"), American Disposal Company, Inc. ("American") (or "the Companies"), and the Staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("Staff"), collectively referred to as the Settling Parties. The Settling Parties agree that this Settlement is in the public interest and should be accepted as a full resolution of all issues in

these dockets. The Settling Parties understand this Settlement is subject to approval of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (the "Commission").

II. INTRODUCTION

2 On April 08, 2013, the Companies filed with the Commission certain tariff revisions designed to increase general rates for the collection, transportation, and disposal of garbage, residential recycling, and residential yard waste in their certificated service territories. The Companies requested an increase in residential, commercial, and drop box service garbage rates of \$ 953,667 (4.21 percent) additional annual revenue; an increase in residential yard waste rates of \$ 299,865 (15.85 percent) additional annual revenue; and an increase in residential recycling rates of \$1,033,470 (25.27 percent) additional annual revenue.

3 On May 10, 2013, the Commission entered Order 01 in Docket TG-130501 and Order 01 in Docket TG-130502, suspending the tariff revisions in those dockets. A Prehearing Conference Order (Order 02) issued on May 21, 2013, consolidated the two dockets and, among other things, established a procedural schedule. On June 20, 2013, and July 11, 2013, the Commission granted motions for continuances of testimony filing dates while the parties discussed settlement.

4 The Parties have reached Settlement of all rate issues in this proceeding and wish to present their agreement for the Commission's consideration. The settling parties therefore adopt the following Settlement, including Attachments A, B and C attached hereto, in the interest of reaching a fair disposition of the issues in this proceeding.

III. SETTLEMENT

A. Rate Increase and Effective Date

5 The Settling Parties agree that the Companies shall be authorized to implement rate changes designed to increase its annual revenues from its residential, commercial, and drop box services garbage customers by \$ 0.00 (zero percent); from its residential yard waste customers by \$198,530 (10.51 percent on average); and from its residential recycling customers by \$845,436 (20.98 percent on average).

6 The changes summarized in paragraph 5 are set forth in greater detail in Attachment A to this Settlement.

7 The Settling Parties agree that the rate changes identified herein should be effective the first day of the month after the Commission approves the Agreement.

B. Rate Spread and Rate Design for Revenue Increase

8 The Settling Parties agree that the agreed total revenue increase of \$1,043,966 will be implemented as shown on Attachment B to this Settlement. Attachment C to this Settlement contains draft tariff sheets that implement this rate spread and rate design.

C. Amortization Period and Requirement to File a General Rate Case

9 The Settling Parties agree that the companies can amortize the expenses of both the loss on the sale of assets and prior year insurance claims over three years, provided that the Companies shall file, no later than April 1, 2016, a general rate case using calendar year 2015 as the 12-month test period. This requirement does not however preclude the company from filing a general rate case(s) prior to this time.

D. Waiver of Initial Order

10 The Settling Parties request that the Commission directly issue its order on this Settlement without an initial order by the Administrative Law Judge. The Settling Parties agree to waive an initial order, if necessary to implement this request.

E. Garbage Rates

11 The Settling Parties agree that the current, effective garbage rates will not change.

F. General Provisions

12 1. The Settling Parties agree that this Settlement is in the public interest and would produce rates for the Company that are fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient. The Settling Parties agree to support this Settlement as a settlement of all contested issues in this proceeding. The Settling Parties further agree that this Settlement, upon its approval by the Commission, resolves and concludes this docket. The Settling Parties understand that this Settlement is not binding on the Commission or any settling party unless and until it is approved.

13 2. The Settling Parties agree that this Settlement represents a compromise in the positions of the Settling Parties. As such, conduct, statements, and documents (excluding those documents attached to this Settlement, Company responses to data requests, and documents filed in response to WAC 480-07-520(4)) that were disclosed in the negotiation of this Settlement shall not be admissible as evidence in this or any other proceeding.

14 3. The Settling Parties agree this Settlement represents the entire agreement of the Settling Parties, and it supersedes any and all prior oral or written understandings or agreements related to this docket or this Settlement, if any, and no such prior understanding, agreement or representation shall be relied upon by any Settling Party. The Settling Parties

have negotiated this Settlement as an integrated document. Accordingly, the Settling Parties recommend that the Commission adopt this Settlement in its entirety.

15 4. The Settling Parties shall cooperate in submitting this Settlement promptly to the Commission for acceptance, and cooperate in supporting this Settlement throughout the Commission's consideration of this Settlement. In particular, each Settling Party shall cooperate in filing supporting documentation, as described in WAC 480 07 740(2)(a) and (b). The Settling Parties agree to support the Settlement throughout the Commission's consideration of this Settlement, and abide by the procedures determined by the Commission for its review of this Settlement. If necessary, each Settling Parties will provide a witness to sponsor and support this Settlement at a Commission hearing. If the Commission decides to hold such a hearing, each Settling Party will recommend that the Commission issue an order adopting the Settlement. In the event the Commission rejects this Settlement, the provisions of WAC 480 07 750(2)(a) shall apply. In the event the Commission accepts the Settlement upon conditions not proposed herein, the provisions of WAC 480-07-750(2)(b) shall apply. In the event the Commission accepts the Settlement upon conditions not proposed herein, or approves resolution of this proceeding through provisions that are different than recommended in this Settlement, each Settling Party reserves the right, upon written notice to the Commission and all parties to this proceeding within five (5) days of the Commission's order, to state its rejection of the conditions. If any Settling Party rejects a proposed new condition, the Settling Parties will: (1) request the prompt reconvening of a prehearing conference for purposes of establishing a procedural schedule for the completion of the case pursuant to WAC 480-07-750(2)(a); and, (2) cooperate in development of a

schedule that concludes the proceeding on the earliest possible date, taking into account the needs of the Settling Parties in participating in hearings and preparing briefs.

16 5. In the event the Commission determines that it will reject the Settlement or accept the Settlement upon conditions not proposed herein, the Settling Parties request that the Commission issue an order as soon as possible so that the Settling Parties may promptly invoke the provisions of WAC 480-07-750.

17 6. The Settling Parties enter into this Settlement to avoid further expense, inconvenience, uncertainty, and delay. By executing this Settlement, no Settling Party shall be deemed to have approved, admitted, or consented to the facts, principles, methods, or theories employed in arriving at the terms of this Settlement, nor shall any party be deemed to have agreed that any provision of this Settlement is appropriate for resolving issues in any other proceeding, except to the extent expressly set forth in the Settlement.

18 7. This Settlement may be executed in counterparts and each signed counterpart shall constitute an original document. A Settling Party may authorize the other Settling Party to sign on the first Settling Party's behalf. A signed signature page that is faxed or emailed is acceptable as an original signature page signed by that Settling Party.

19 8. This Settlement is the product of negotiation and no part shall be construed against any Settling Party on the basis that it was the drafter.

20 9. The effective date of this Settlement is the date of the Commission order approving it, subject to the procedures described in paragraph 15 above.

This Settlement is entered into by each Settling Party as of the date entered below.

Item 10 - Application of Rates -- General

Rates named in this tariff cover the collection, transportation, and disposal of solid waste. When specifically referred to, rates also cover the collection and transportation of recyclable materials and/or yardwaste.

Title 81.77 of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) and Chapter 480-70 of the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) govern operations of solid waste collection companies and the tariffs companies must file with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC).

Unless exceptions are shown, all materials must be placed on the same level as the streets or alleys.

The company may charge additional amounts for disposal fees only when specifically stated in the tariff and separately shown on customer bills.

Item 15 -- Holiday Pickup -- Regularly Scheduled Service

When a pickup is missed due to the company's observance of a holiday, the company will provide service, at no additional cost to the customer, on an alternate day.

A list of the holidays the company observes is shown in Item 60.

For application of rates in this tariff, the company defines alternate day to mean the following:

The Carrier shall observe Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Years Day as the only Holidays that will require alternate days. Service that normally would have been provided on these days will be provided on the first day (including Saturday) following each respective holiday and the day following within the week.

Item 16 -- Change in Pickup Schedule

When a company changes the pick-up date for its certificate area, or a portion of its certificate area, the company must notify all customers in the affected area of that change.

Notice must be made at least seven days before implementation of a new pickup schedule and may be made via mail, personal contact, or by a notice being affixed to the customer's solid waste receptacle.

Item 17 -- Refunds

Credit due the customer. When there has been a transaction that results in a credit due the customer, the following apply:

- (a) If the amount due is five dollars or less, an adjustment will be made to the customer's account. The adjustment must be shown on the next regular bill.
- (b) If the amount due is more than five dollars, the customer may accept an account adjustment or may request a refund.
 - (1) If the customer elects to have an account adjustment made, the adjustment must show on the next regular billing.
 - (2) If the customer elects to receive a refund, the company must issue a check within thirty days of the request.

Overcharges. Once a company becomes aware that it has overcharged a customer, it must provide a refund or an account adjustment credit to the customer. The customer must be given a choice as to which option is preferred. The refund or credit must be the amount overcharged in the three years before the date of discovery.

- (a) If the customer elects to have an account adjustment made, the adjustment must show on the next regular billing.
- (b) If the customer elects to receive a refund, the company must issue a check within thirty days of the request.

Prepayments. If a customer has paid service fees in advance, service is discontinued during the pre-billed period, and the customer is due a refund, the following apply:

- (a) A company must honor all requests for refunds of the unused portion of prepayments.
- (b) If the customer provides a forwarding address to the company or one can be obtained from the Post Office, the company must issue a refund check no more than thirty days following the customer's request.
- (c) If the customer cannot be located or did not provide a forwarding address and the U.S. Post Office cannot furnish a forwarding address, the amount may be presumed to be abandoned and is subject to the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act after one year.

Item 18 -- Billing, Advance Billing, and Payment Delinquency Dates

Billing period. A company may bill its customers for one, two, or three months of service.

Advance billing and payment delinquency dates. The following chart defines the maximum period allowed for advance billing and the date when a bill may be considered delinquent:

Item 20 -- Definitions

NOTE: The definitions shown on the first three pages of this item are standard, in most cases prescribed by rule. Companies may not amend these definitions, except to fill in blanks for maximum weights of various receptacles. Companies wishing to add definitions specific to their company's operations must include those definitions on a separate page, entitled "Company-specific definitions." A blank sheet is provided for that purpose.

Bale: Material compressed by machine and securely tarped or banded.

Bulky materials: Empty carriers, cartons, boxes, crates, etc., or materials offered for disposal, all of which may be readily handled without shoveling.

Charge: A set flat fee for performing a service. Or, the result of multiplying a rate for a unit times the number of units transported.

Commercial billing: Service billed to a commercial customer or billed to, and paid for, by a property manager or owner rather than a residential tenant.

Compactor disconnect/reconnect charge: A flat fee established by the solid waste collection company for the service of disconnecting a compactor from a drop box or container before taking it to be dumped, and then reconnecting the compactor when the drop box or container is returned to the customer's site.

Gate charge: A flat fee charged for opening, unlocking, or closing gates in order to pick up solid waste.

Loose material: Material not set out in bags or containers, including materials that must be shoveled.

Multi-family residence: Any structure housing two or more dwelling units. One dwelling unit if service is paid by the property owner. (N)

Packer: A device or vehicle specially designed to pack loose materials.

Pass through fee: A fee collected by a solid waste collection company on behalf of a third party when the fee is billed directly to the customer without markup or markdown. See Item 230.

Permanent service: Container and drop-box service provided at the customer's request for more than 90 days.

Rate: A price per unit or per service. A rate is multiplied times the number of units transported or the number of times a service is performed to determine a charge.

Solid waste receptacle: Includes the following items, with the following meanings:

Automated cart means a cart designed to be picked up and emptied by mechanical means. The specific type and size are to be defined in rate items.

Can means a receptacle made of durable, corrosion-resistant, nonabsorbent material that is watertight, and has a close-fitting cover and two handles. A can holds more than twenty gallons, but not more than thirty-two gallons. A can may not weigh more than 45 pounds when filled.

Cart means a wheeled plastic container. A cart may also be referred to as a toter. If supplied by a customer, a cart must be compatible with the company's equipment. The size and type of cart that is compatible will be established in each company's tariff.

Container means a detachable receptacle (normally designed to hold at least a cubic yard of solid waste) from which materials are collected by mechanically lifting the receptacle and emptying the contents into the company's vehicle.

Drop box means a detachable receptacle used to provide solid waste collection service by the receptacle being placed on the company's vehicle by mechanical means and transported to a disposal site.

Drum means a metal or plastic container of approximately fifty gallon capacity, generally used for oils or solvents. A drum may not weigh more than 50 pounds when filled.

Litter receptacle means a container not over sixty-gallon capacity, generally placed in shopping centers and along streets or highways for litter. A litter receptacle may not weigh more than 50 pounds when filled.

Micro-mini can means a can made of durable, corrosion-resistant, nonabsorbent material that is watertight and has a close-fitting cover. A micro-mini can may not hold more than ten gallons. A micro-mini can may not weigh more than 20 pounds when filled.

Mini-can means a can made of durable, corrosion-resistant, nonabsorbent material that is watertight and has a close-fitting cover. A mini-can may not hold more than twenty gallons. A mini-can may not weigh more than 30 pounds when filled.

Recycling bin or container means a bin or container designed or designated for the collection of recyclables. The size and type of recycling bin or container will be established in each company's tariff.

Toter means a wheeled plastic container. A toter may also be referred to as a cart. If supplied by customer, a toter must be compatible with the company's equipment. The size and type of toter that is compatible will be established in each company's tariff.

Unit means a receptacle made of durable, corrosion-resistant, nonabsorbent material, that is watertight, and has a close-fitting cover and two handles. A unit holds more than twenty gallons, but not more than thirty-two gallons or four cubic feet. A unit may not weigh more than 45 pounds when filled.

Where agreed upon between the company and the customer, and where allowable under local ordinance, a box, carton, cardboard barrel, or other suitable container may be substituted for a solid waste can, for a single pick-up that includes removal of the container, if it meets the size and weight limits established in the company's tariff.

Yardwaste bin or container means a bin or container specifically designed or designated for the collection of yardwaste. Each company's tariff will refer to a specific type of yardwaste bin or container to be used in a service area. The type, size, weight, etc., of this type of bin or container will often be set by local government plans or ordinances.

Special pick-up:

A pick-up requested by the customer at a time other than the regularly scheduled pick-up time, that does not require the special dispatch of a truck. If a special dispatch is required, the company will assess time rates established in the company's tariff.

Supplement:

A page added to the beginning of a tariff, normally to cover emergency, temporary, or special situations. An example is a page issued to show a special surcharge imposed by a city.

Temporary service:

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Item 10 - Application of Rates -- General

Rates named in this tariff cover the collection, transportation, and disposal of solid waste. When specifically referred to, rates also cover the collection and transportation of recyclable materials and/or yardwaste.

Title 81.77 of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) and Chapter 480-70 of the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) govern operations of solid waste collection companies and the tariffs companies must file with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC).

Unless exceptions are shown, all materials must be placed on the same level as the streets or alleys.

The company may charge additional amounts for disposal fees only when specifically stated in the tariff and separately shown on customer bills.

Item 15 -- Holiday Pickup -- Regularly Scheduled Service

When a pickup is missed due to the company's observance of a holiday, the company will provide service, at no additional cost to the customer, on an alternate day.

A list of the holidays the company observes is shown in Item 60.

For application of rates in this tariff, the company defines alternate day to mean the following:

The Carrier shall observe Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Years Day as the only Holidays that will require alternate days. Service that normally would have been provided on these days will be provided on the first day (including Saturday) following each respective holiday and the day following within the week.

Item 16 -- Change in Pickup Schedule

When a company changes the pick-up date for its certificate area, or a portion of its certificate area, the company must notify all customers in the affected area of that change.

Notice must be made at least seven days before implementation of a new pickup schedule and may be made via mail, personal contact, or by a notice being affixed to the customer's solid waste receptacle.

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Item 17 -- Refunds

Credit due the customer. When there has been a transaction that results in a credit due the customer, the following apply:

- (a) If the amount due is five dollars or less, an adjustment will be made to the customer's account. The adjustment must be shown on the next regular bill.
- (b) If the amount due is more than five dollars, the customer may accept an account adjustment or may request a refund.
 - (1) If the customer elects to have an account adjustment made, the adjustment must show on the next regular billing.
 - (2) If the customer elects to receive a refund, the company must issue a check within thirty days of the request.

Overcharges. Once a company becomes aware that it has overcharged a customer, it must provide a refund or an account adjustment credit to the customer. The customer must be given a choice as to which option is preferred. The refund or credit must be the amount overcharged in the three years before the date of discovery.

- (a) If the customer elects to have an account adjustment made, the adjustment must show on the next regular billing.
- (b) If the customer elects to receive a refund, the company must issue a check within thirty days of the request.

Prepayments. If a customer has paid service fees in advance, service is discontinued during the pre-billed period, and the customer is due a refund, the following apply:

- (a) A company must honor all requests for refunds of the unused portion of prepayments.
- (b) If the customer provides a forwarding address to the company or one can be obtained from the Post Office, the company must issue a refund check no more than thirty days following the customer's request.
- (c) If the customer cannot be located or did not provide a forwarding address and the U.S. Post Office cannot furnish a forwarding address, the amount may be presumed to be abandoned and is subject to the Uniform Unclaimed Property Act after one year.

Gate charge:	A flat fee charged for opening, unlocking, or closing gates in order to pick up solid waste.
Loose material:	Material not set out in bags or containers, including materials that must be shoveled.
Multi-family residence:	Any structure housing two or more dwelling units. One dwelling unit if service is paid by the property owner. (N)
Packer:	A device or vehicle specially designed to pack loose materials.
Pass through fee:	A fee collected by a solid waste collection company on behalf of a third party when the fee is billed directly to the customer without markup or markdown. See Item 230.
Permanent service:	Container and drop-box service provided at the customer's request for more than 90 days.
Rate:	A price per unit or per service. A rate is multiplied times the number of units transported or the number of times a service is performed to determine a charge.
Solid waste receptacle:	Includes the following items, with the following meanings: Automated cart means a cart designed to be picked up and emptied by mechanical means. The specific type and size are to be defined in rate items.

Cart means a wheeled plastic container. A cart may also be referred to as a toter. If supplied by a customer, a cart must be compatible with the company's equipment. The size and type of cart that is compatible will be established in each company's tariff.

Container means a detachable receptacle (normally designed to hold at least a cubic yard of solid waste) from which materials are collected by mechanically lifting the receptacle and emptying the contents into the company's vehicle.

Drop box means a detachable receptacle used to provide solid waste collection service by the receptacle being placed on the company's vehicle by mechanical means and transported to a disposal site.

Drum means a metal or plastic container of approximately fifty gallon capacity, generally used for oils or solvents. A drum may not weigh more than 50 pounds when filled.

Litter receptacle means a container not over sixty-gallon capacity, generally placed in shopping centers and along streets or highways for litter. A litter receptacle may not weigh more than 50 pounds when filled.

Micro-mini can means a can made of durable, corrosion-resistant, nonabsorbent material that is watertight and has a close-fitting cover. A micro-mini can may not hold more than ten gallons. A micro-mini can may not weigh more than 20 pounds when filled.

Mini-can means a can made of durable, corrosion-resistant, nonabsorbent material that is watertight and has a close-fitting cover. A mini-can may not hold more than twenty gallons. A mini-can may not weigh more than 30 pounds when filled.

Recycling bin or container means a bin or container designed or designated for the collection of recyclables. The size and type of recycling bin or container will be established in each company's tariff.

Where agreed upon between the company and the customer, and where allowable under local ordinance, a box, carton, cardboard barrel, or other suitable container may be substituted for a solid waste can, for a single pick-up that includes removal of the container, if it meets the size and weight limits established in the company's tariff.

Yardwaste bin or container means a bin or container specifically designed or designated for the collection of yardwaste. Each company's tariff will refer to a specific type of yardwaste bin or container to be used in a service area. The type, size, weight, etc., of this type of bin or container will often be set by local government plans or ordinances.

Special pick-up:

A pick-up requested by the customer at a time other than the regularly scheduled pick-up time, that does not require the special dispatch of a truck. If a special dispatch is required, the company will assess time rates established in the company's tariff.

Supplement:

A page added to the beginning of a tariff, normally to cover emergency, temporary, or special situations. An example is a page issued to show a special surcharge imposed by a city.

Temporary service:

Temporary service means providing container or drop-box service at the customer's request, for a period of ninety days or less.

Unlatching:

Another term for a gate charge. A flat fee imposed by a solid waste collection company when the company's personnel must unlatch a gate or door to perform pickup service.

Unlocking:

A flat fee imposed by a solid waste collection company when the company's personnel must unlock padlocks or other locking devices to perform pickup services.

Due care. Other than to offer reasonable care, the company assumes no responsibility for articles left on or near solid waste receptacles.

Liability for damage. When a customer requests that a company provide service and damage occurs to the customer's driveway due to reasons not in the control of the company, the company will assume no responsibility for the damage.
