At the request of Commission Staff, please find enclosed one original hard copy and one CD containing PDF copies of Qwest's redlined *WA Catalog No. 2* indicating changes to the catalog that have occurred as a result of all the AFOR compliance filings to date.¹ These documents are provided for informational purposes only. Qwest is copying other parties to the docket with this cover letter, but is not providing copies of the requested catalog to them with this filing. If other parties are interested in receiving a copy of the complete redlined catalog, they should make their request to me.

Qwest understands that the purpose of this document is to provide Staff with a baseline reference catalog that indicates, by redlined or shaded markings, all the changes that have occurred to Qwest's *WA Catalog No. 2* as a result of Qwest's AFOR Compliance Filing Nos. 3635T and 3639T, and Transmittal Nos. 3636T and 3640T, including replacement pages. Specifically, new sections that have been added to the catalog are indicated by 'underlining' while sections of the catalog that contain services and provisions that have been deleted from the tariff, but still

¹ In addition to the catalog changes that have occurred as a result of moving certain services to be treated as competitively classified under the AFOR from tariff to catalog, Qwest has also made a number of other changes to its catalog, in collaboration with Staff, to provide references regarding the location of service information (tariff or catalog) and to reflect other administrative changes that have occurred with the transfer of services.

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remain in the catalog, are indicated by 'shading'.¹ Any, provisions that have been deleted from the catalog are indicated by 'strike-through'.²

It should be noted that in conjunction with its recent Compliance Filing No. 3639T made on December 31, 2007, Qwest provided the redlined changes to its *WA Catalog No. 2* that occurred as a result of that filing in Transmittal No. 3640T. This additional document is being provided at the request of Staff to aid its efforts to track changes during the term of Qwest's AFOR. ¹ Prior to AFOR approval, Qwest's digital business services were competitively classified only in certain wire centers. As such, Qwest was required to have the same services in both its tariff and its catalog with the distinction being whether the service was being provided in a competitive or non-competitive wire center.

² Qwest would note that the 'underlining', 'shading', and 'strike-through' devices explained above were used in the relined versions of the previous catalog transmittals – 3636T and 3640T, including replacement pages.
