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PC-13 Please reference paragraph 4, at page 3, of CenturyLink's response to the UTC complaint in which CenturyLink states, "CenturyLink admits that Comcast is present in the subdivision and is verifying the distances alleged in this paragraph. Until CenturyLink can validate those allegations, they are denied." Please answer the following questions:

a. Has CenturyLink validated the distances?

**Response:** Yes.

b. If so, can you confirm the distance between the pedestal and the consumer's property?

**Response:** There is some question about what the consumer's address is. County records show the consumer's address to be [REDACTED]. If this is the correct address the cable path distance is 152 feet. If the consumer's address is [REDACTED], the cable path distance is between 45 and 47 feet depending on the extent of interfering substructure (other utilities & communications cable from CATV, etc.)

c. If the distances have not been confirmed, please state when CenturyLink anticipates that it will confirm the distances.
