- Q. Please state your name and business address.
- A. My name is Booga K. Gilbertson. My business address is 10885 NE 4th Street,P.O. Box 97034, Bellevue WA 98009-9734.
- Q. By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
- A. I am employed by Puget Sound Energy, Inc. ("PSE") as Director Performance Excellence.
- Q. What are your duties as Director Performance Excellence?
- A. As Director Performance Excellence, I am responsible for enhancing service quality to customers through implementing sustainable improvements in reliability, compliance, service, and efficiency. My specific duties are to identify opportunities across key operational and customer service functions that will enhance customer responsiveness, reliability, compliance, safety and efficiency and implement broad-reaching end-to-end sustainable process improvements.

 I report to the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer.

A. I have been employed by PSE since 1985.

For the first three quarters of 2007, I was the director of SAP Roadmap and Transmission Contracts. In this position, I directed a corporate information technology roadmap initiative including start-up staffing and facilities, contract negotiations and administration, PMO, governance, implementation of an ERP system upgrade, related human resources, work management, and training systems, and a new fixed asset accounting system.

From 2003 until 2006, I was the director of Planning and Performance.
