Minute (Statement):

We strongly encourage Puget Sound Energy (PSE) to reconsider its Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) which forecasts continuing to generate more of our electrical power from fossil fuels. The overwhelming scientific evidence available indicates that humans are causing devastating and irreversible climate instability by releasing huge quantities of greenhouse gases. We must ALL do EVERYTHING we can to stop detrimental emissions into our atmosphere.

We encourage PSE to revise its IRP to:

- Prioritize low impact hydroelectric power over natural gas and coal burning energy production to complement wind and solar sources and assure continuity and reliability of supply.
