COMMISSION STAFF’S RESPONSE
TO MOTION TO WITHDRAW

I. INTRODUCTION

1 DTG Enterprises, Inc., d/b/a DTG Recycle (“DTG”) seeks to withdraw its solid waste application related to e-waste, which was filed on August 5, 2024, and updated on August 27, 2024. Staff does not object to DTG’s Motion to Withdraw.

II. STATEMENT OF FACTS

2 The Commission set a procedural schedule in this matter in Order 01.¹ DTG states that it would like to withdraw its application after receiving feedback from parties. DTG states that it will evaluate further the scope of its proposed services.

III. STATEMENT OF ISSUES

3 Whether the Commission should allow DTG to withdraw its application, without prejudice.

IV. ARGUMENT

4 Staff does not object to withdrawal of DTG’s application related to e-waste. While there is a procedural schedule established for this matter, no parties have filed testimony. If DTG reevaluates the scope of its proposed services and refiles, the inquiry could be more focused. Withdrawing the filing now does not appear to prejudice any party.
