- ¹ On January 20, 2006, Pacific Cruises Northwest, Inc. d/b/a Victoria San Juan Cruises filed with the commission an application (No. B-079421) to transfer all rights under Certificate B-120 in the name of San Juan Island Shuttle, Express, Inc. Notice of the Application was published in the commission's weekly docket of February 13, 2006.
- The commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 81 RCW, which authorizes it to regulate persons seeking to furnish commercial ferry service under chapter 81.84 RCW and chapter 480-51 WAC. The issues in this proceeding include whether granting the authority requested in the Application is consistent with the public interest.
- Another proceeding, Application No. B-79418 by SEAN MCNAMARA
 d/b/a PACIFIC SEA TAXI, is pending before the commission in Docket TS-060061.
 The two proceedings are interrelated at least to the extent of having common parties and representation. The commission finds there is good cause to conduct a joint prehearing conference in this proceeding and in Docket TS-060061. The commission will give individual notice of the joint conference in Docket TS-060061.
