Dear Abizer:

As you are aware, on June 30, 2009, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("commission") issued a Penalty Assessment against A&A Moving & Delivery in the amount of \$100 for violation of commission rules requiring household goods carriers to file annual reports by May 1 each year. A&A Moving & Delivery failed to file its annual report for 2008, and has incurred a penalty of \$100.

The commission has not received the \$100 payment due and owing.

This is to notify you that the commission intends to forward your outstanding debt to a collection agency for collection. You likely will incur additional expenses and fees, including costs of collection, attorney's fees, and interest. These expenses and fees will be added to your outstanding \$100 balance.
